Craig Johnston, Nick Fryters and Brian Steckley also counted Oshawa goals. Assisting on two goals was Ted Lindsay.

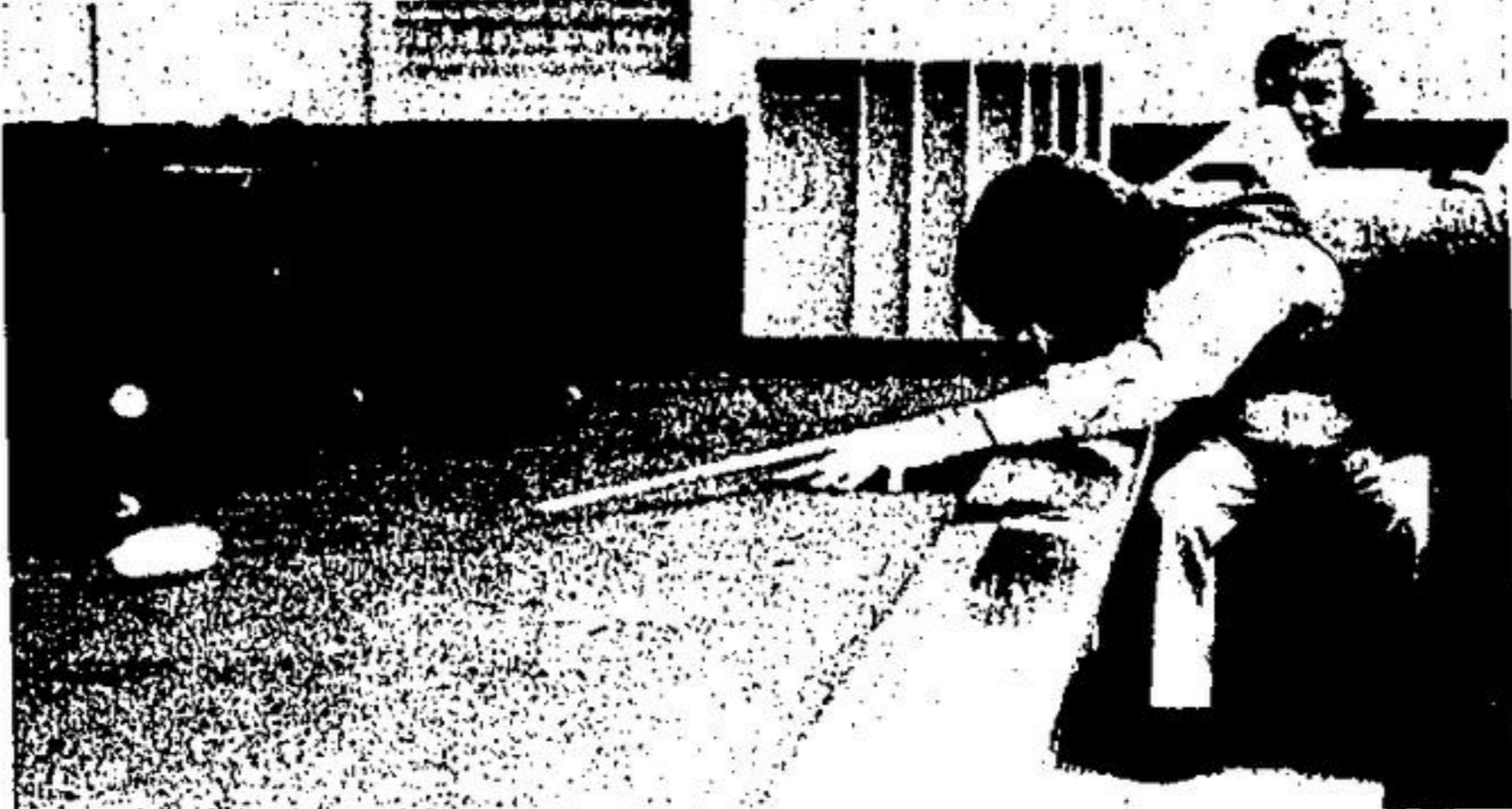
Tim Briggs and Bruce Sheppard returned fire for Hamilton with Andrew Ferguson and Scott Hibbard helping out.
