a faithful member of the Ladies' Aid for many years, and is now leaving the community.

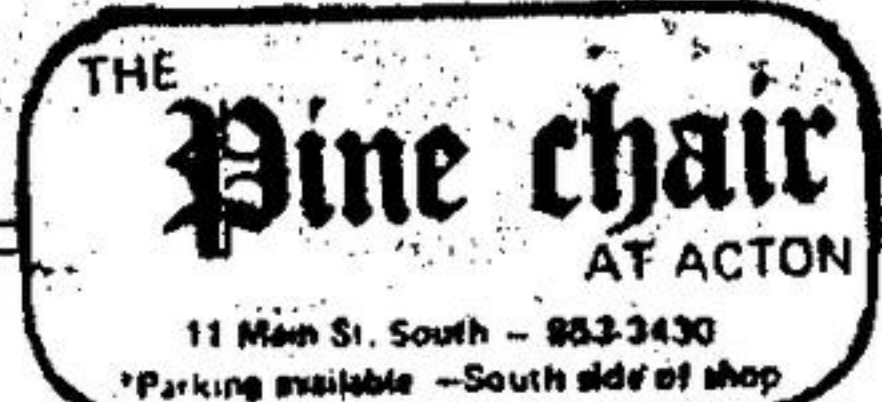
Mrs. George Lang, program convener, read a poem on Colonel John McCrae, and conducted a contest on the word Remembrance, which was won by Mrs. Campbell.
