## Sabres bolster lines in three for one deal

Sabres bolstered their defence and forward lines in a three for one trade and waiver deal with Streetsville Derbys Saturday.

High scoring forward Chris Costello goes to Streetsville in return for defenceman Dave Bodley, forward Doug Elliott and another player to be named later this week.

"I think it'll (the trade) help us more than them (Streetsville). I think it'll help Chris," Sabre manager Fred Buchanan said.

Costello, who plays here tonight against his former teammates, scored 19 goals and assisted on 14 as a Sabre.

**Walers**  
Under the agreement, outlined by Mr. Buchanan, the Sabres traded Costello for Bodley and picked up two additional players. The other players count for the two extra waiver cards granted the Acton team by the Ontario Hockey Association. The club got consideration for player assistance because it's a first year Junior B team.

Costello will return to Acton next season if he doesn't go to college and Bodley will also be here if a major A club doesn't pick him up, Mr. Buchanan said.

Bodley scored an unassisted goal here Saturday in his first game as a Sabre against Oakville. He has about 30 scoring points.

When Costello came to the Sabres in October from the Derbys, Streetsville's Tom Barrett asked that if by January 9 the Sabres have no hope of a playoff spot, they return Costello, according to Mr. Buchanan.

**Rules change**  
In discussions, which ended Saturday, Barrett asked for an early return of Costello because Streetsville ran into injuries, Mr. Buchanan said. And because he was changing the rules a little, Barrett sweetened the pot.

The advantages of the deal for Acton, Mr. Buchanan said, are that Sabres get "a very good defenceman" and also the effect of the exchange on local players. "It sure shook some of them up," the manager said. We have a couple of extra wingers, and some of the town kids may be out of a job, he added.

The one disadvantage for Sabres is that they've lost their second highest scorer.

The third player in the deal from Streetsville could not be named before today because he's yet to be told that he is no longer with Derbys.

The girls triple scores are Sue Thomson (707), Deb James (621), Kathleen Cheyne (602), Pat Storey (542) and Mickie Phillips

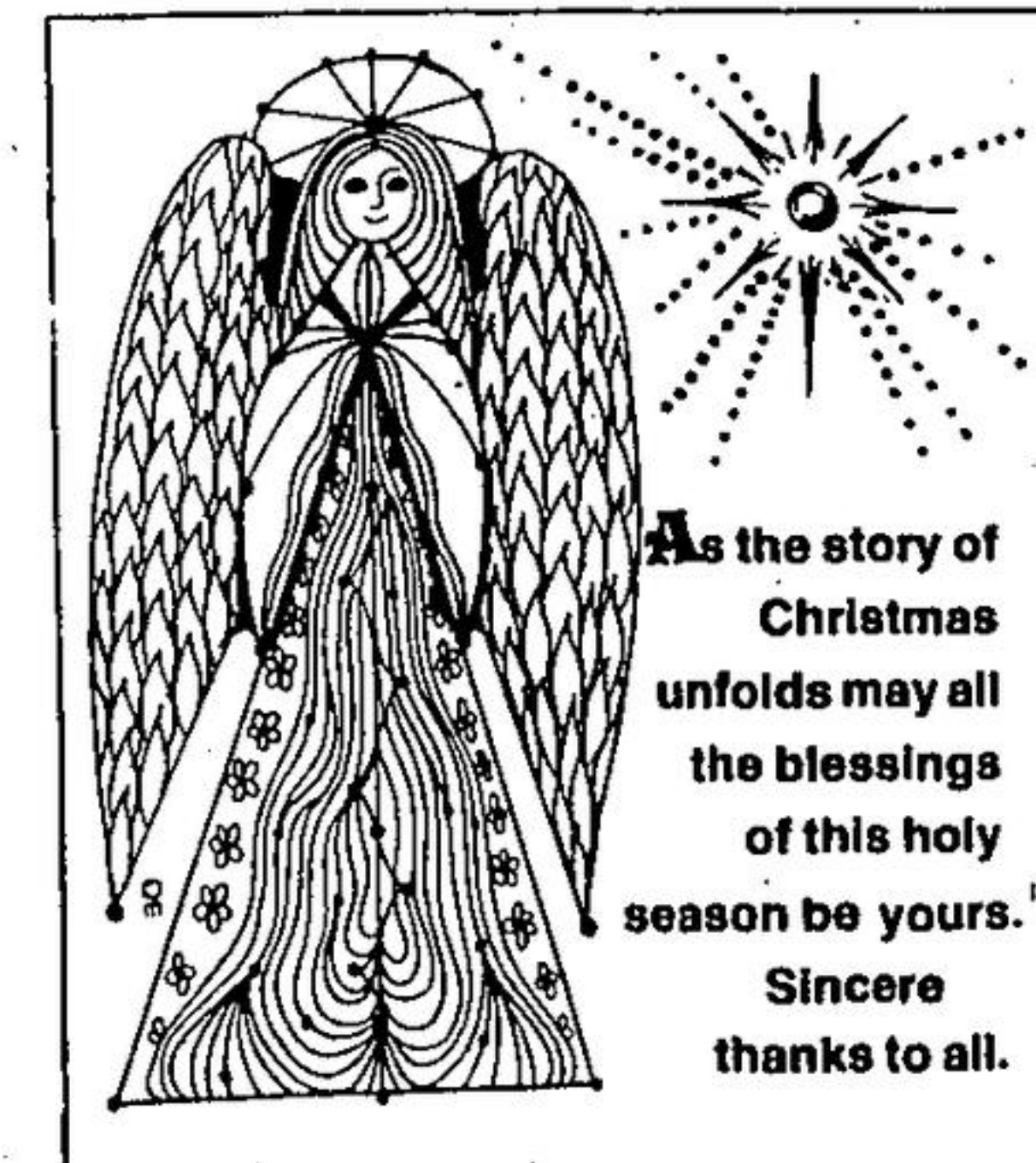

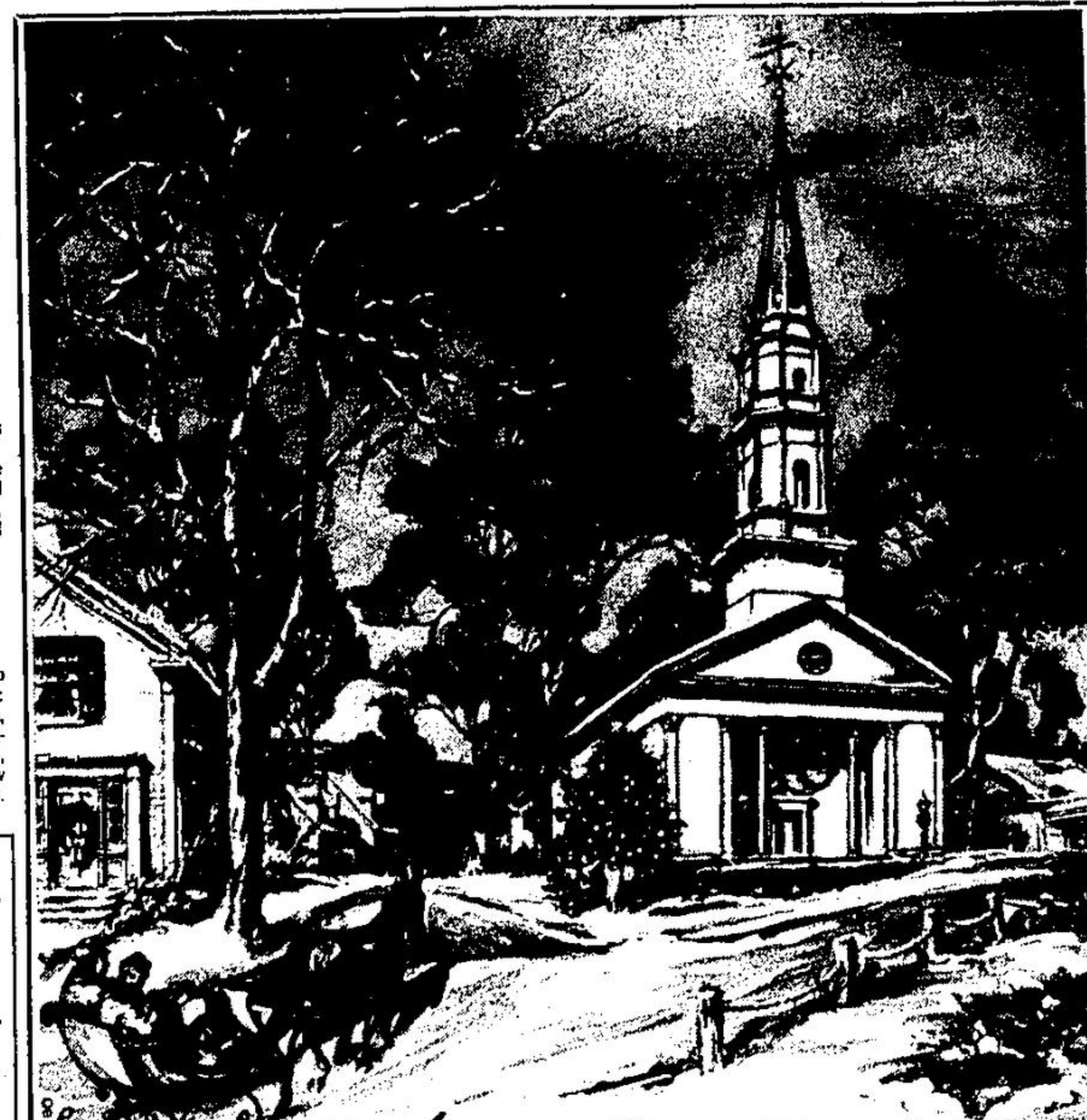
