Every person who fails to comply with Section 2 or Section 7 of this By-Law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a line of not more than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars exclusive of costs, and every such fine shall be recoverable under the provisions of the Summary Convictions Act, R.S.O. 1970.
