Halton Hills councillors will have to wait until municipal water starts being piped to the Seventh Line municipal building before getting glasses and pitchers.

Put mayors on commission

Each of the four Halton mayors should have a seat on the Halton Board of Police Commissioners, according to Oakville Mayor Harry Bar-

Barrett told regional council that the Bill 151 Review Committee would be considering a recommendation to that effect.

Mayor Barrett and Halton Hills Mayor Tom Hill were both reappointed to the Commission by Council at a meeting Wednesday.

During the same meeting Milton Mayor Don Gordon Walter Councillors Mulkewich of Burlington, Roy Booth of Halton Hills and Laurie Mannell of Oakville were added to the Bill 151-Review Committee.
