New numbering system to be in effect May 1

All buildings and vacant lots in the village now have a number! For years a problem has existed because of the haphazard numbering of buildings in Rockwood. The system once used fell into disuse and because there had been no master plan, numbers were issued to buildings in an illogical manner.

A study of the problem was recently made under the supervision of the Director of Planning for the County of Wellington and from this came a plan that would re-allocate new numbers to present buildings, and allow for future growth in the village by the allocation of numbers to all vacant lots. The Board of Trustees asks

for the co-operation of all owners to bring the new street numbering into effect on May 1, 1977.

Reasons
There are many reasons for the need of clearly marked street numbers. They are summarized as follows: instant location by the Fire Department in case of fire calls; ambulance and other emergency services; accurate marking of all buildings for Bell Canada for maintenance, repair and new services; reading of hydro meters, census taking and other municipal activity requiring house calls; driver's licences, insurance policies and all documents requiring street numbers.

The new numbers will be incorporated in township assessment rolls and also Bell Canada directory when the next update is made. Individual notices will be sent to all owners in the very near future. Village Secretary Len Hockey is in the process of working on notices for every owner.

Home and School Assoc. revived

In 1970 a Home and School Association existed in Rockwood that was headed by Audrey Hudson. It was a properly constituted body affiliated with the Ontario Federation of Home and School Associations. The Rockwood Home and School operated on the constitution provided by the provincial association. A constitution is a body of rules and regulations that all members are obliged to follow and these rules set out more or less what the association run by an executive can or cannot do. It exists for the protection of each individual member of the association.

Meeting of interested parents and teachers took place nothing was decided. Again this year, Maureen McLeod tried to get an organization going and at a recent meeting a number of interested parents drew up an agenda for a public meeting and prepared a list of what they considered suitable and good aims for an association. At the public meeting chaired by Chris Bertelsen at

Rockwood Centennial Public School, 30 parents and 19 teachers attended. This meeting adopted the aims of the organization with a few changes. Mrs. Marian Tubman suggested that Eramosa Public School might be invited to join the Home and School. Consequently a joint meeting of the new founding members, the old executive and representatives from both schools was called for Monday, Jan. 31. Election

At this meeting, proposed amendments to the constitution were drawn up, a slate of nominations for officers was prepared and an agenda for the next public meeting was compiled. The general meeting to adopt the constitution and elect officers of the executive as well as establish the first order of business will be done on Thursday, Feb. 24 at 8 p.m. at Rockwood Centennial Public School in the Music Room. Chairman Chris Bertelsen stresses that this is the time for people who have interest in the school and opinions on such matters as the bussing of students to Fergus to attend this meeting when the organization will be establishing the first order of business.
