Campbellville residents want their school kept open because it is an important focal point of the community and they believe it is a waste of time and money to subject their children to riding on buses every day for two hours to attend classes at Brookville School.

Speaking on behalf of Campbellville parents, over 200 of whom turned out for Thursday's meeting of Halton Board of Education, Beverley Campbell said the board should look at future growth in the area since it will provide the needed school population.

She noted there are many couples in the area who don't have children now but will likely have some later and noted statistics prove exuples are having children when they are in their late as and early 30s these days

"If there is a rise in the birth rate and the board has closed the school and sold the land where will these children go and at what price. It seems to be a most unwise decision to close the school. It will be a devastating blow to parents. pupils and the community if the board closes our little school," She declared.

The board will make a decision on the fate of Campbellville School this Thursday. A brief prepared by the parents said it is much better for the four year old going into sebool for the first time to go to a small rural school than to have to be put on a bus and spend two hours going to and from school every day.

Campbell said three new get the most out of school homes built in the village not since they will not likely arrive in an "eager or wakeful state of mind."

They said a small school is much more personal and helps develop a person's identity much better than a large

"Within the Campbellville school, the children are very much looked upon as individuals as the teachers can become familiar with both the child and his family."

The parents see no advantage in having their children at Brookville where there are better gym and library facilities and find facilities at Campbellville adequate.

They suggest the school's boundaries could be changed to increase the student population and noted many children living just north of Highway 401 are closer to Campbellville than Brookville School, where they now




