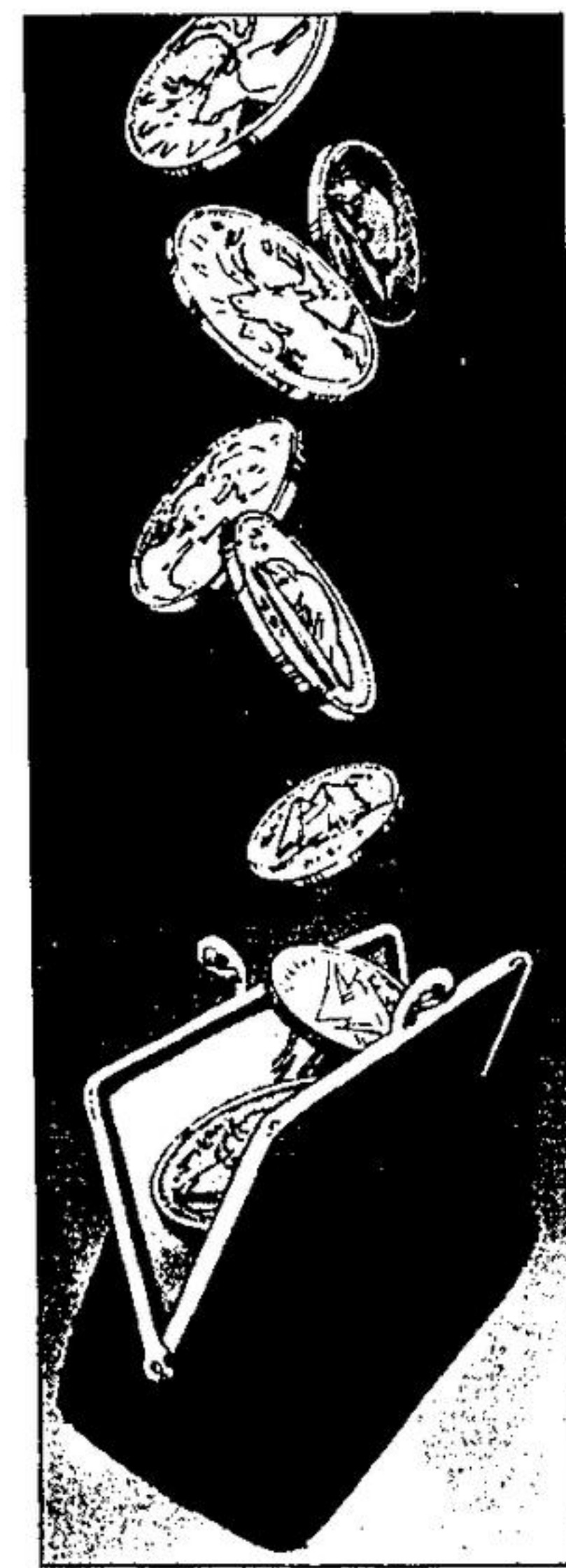
Congratulations to all bowlers who won their "I Beat My Average" crests on Saturday.
