Oaklands comments diphtheria outbreak

Officials of Oaklands Regional Centre in Oakville have issued a statement indicating that they do not believe that the recent outbreak of diphtheria started at the centre. The statement is in response to recent publicity concerning the outbreak.

During a recent press conference Medical Officer of Health for Halton Dr. J.H. Chamberlain indicated he felt the initial case was at the Centre, not from the community at large.

Four Halton residents have been diagnosed as carrying diphtheria organisms. Three of them are children living at the centre and the fourth is a teacher at Morden School in Oakville.

Children from the centre take some of their classes at Morden School.

A letter co-signed by Executive Administrator Don Bath and Dr. D.G. Schooling, the doctor at the institution, says, "it is most unlikely that any of the three carriers we detected in Oaklands Regional Centre arrived with diphtheria. As no other carriers were detected in Oaklands, it is within the realm of possibility that they did acquire the diphtheria organism from an outside source.

His suspicion is supported by a senior consultant with the Ministry of Health.
