The tongue-in-cheek query wasn't appreciated at municipal offices but several people confused by the timing of this year's switch phoned to thank us for the reminder.

Town officials passed a proclamation Monday night proclaiming DST retroactive to 2 a.m. Sunday and said they hadn't forgotten but just left it over until April 25.

We were honestly confused at the time of going to press despite assurance that it was a province-wide regulation because we had knowledge that other municipalities passed the appropriate proclamation. Apparently enquiries here caused some confusion, however, and notices were sent home from schools and many enquiries were made of councillors.

In any event the confusion has been cleared up and Halton Hills is now officially on Daylight Saving Time until Sunday, October 30.




