Gray received publicity in the local media when he developed a position paper on waste management and went on record as favoring a multi-site landfill proposition in Halton.

In an interview over the weekend he said he had taken an interest and worked actively for the GO Train Extension to Milton, a senior citizen building in Acton and Georgetown and a nursing home in Georgetown.

Gray said his team is all set to go. The five local associations in the different parts of the riding have all held meetings and have people on the campaign team.

The team includes specialists in riding research, policy, personnel and signs and canvassing. He said he has 1,500 people working on the campaign.

Gray said his people would have signs up early this year. "We have every intention of working hard and working to win."

Tory headquarters is located at the Georgetown Market Plaza. The phone number there is 877-2841. NDP candidate Bill Johnston is back for his second attempt to win in Halton-Burlington. He says he never really stopped working and doing what he could for people.

"We haven't been dragging our heels. When the Gallup polls came out we knew it wouldn't be long before Davis went to the people taking advantage of his new acclaimed popularity."

While Johnston fought a colorful and spirited fight last time around the organization behind him was weak and some said he was running a one man campaign.

This time Johnston says there'll be more people working with him and more money to spend in the campaign.

He says the province is swinging towards a two party system and he hopes to pick up some of the Liberal votes leaving it as a two way fight between himself and Tory George Gray in Halton-Burlington.

"The NDP has had people at canvassers school as well. We'll be more professional and there'll be more of us this year."

Greg Murtagh of Milton will be Johnston's campaign manager and Bill Cumpstey will work on his election committee as a media representative.

Johnston said that Cumpstey is away on vacation right now and will miss the first part of the campaign.

Both Murtagh and Cumpstey have been active in other campaigns Johnston said. He said Murtagh had served as assistant secretary to Tommy Douglas.

Johnston has maintained his interest in environmental issues as well as working with the ratepayers group in Nassagaweya and the Halton Hills Concerned Citizens' Group.

That group was formed when Domtar closed down in Georgetown and the town faced a rash of shutdowns and layoffs. That group assisted in expediting placements and cutting through the red tape with unemployment and workmen's compensation claims.

Johnston himself lost his job at Domtar. That could hamper his effort this time around. He recently started work at the Canadian Centre for Inland Waters at Burlington. He said he'd be applying for three weeks leave of absence this week but isn't certain how much time he'll have to devote.

Julian Reed said his organization is all in place. He said headquarters have been rented in Acton, Milton and Burlington and an office will be opened in Georgetown. As an incumbent Reed said he'd be looking at a more hard hitting campaign pressed into a shorter time because of the constituency work that still has to be done.

Reed scoffed at a remark reported recently and attributed to George Gray, his Tory opponent, Gray was reported as saying majority government is necessary so cabinet ministers wouldn't have to spend so much time in the legislature.

"That's where they should be. You can't govern by remote control. They governed by bureaucracy for a long time but with minority government we've made cracks in that."

41 cents an hour

Halton Hills outside workers, members of Local 73, C.U.P.E., will receive a 41 cent an hour across the board pay increase.

Negotiations between the town and the union were settled amicably.

The new rate pays a probationary worker \$5.46 an hour, a laborer \$5.73 an hour, a semi-skilled worker \$6.33, an operator \$6.76 and a mechanic \$6.87.
