Contact Centre supports gun control proposals

The Ontario Association of Telephone Distress Centres (OATDC) has passed a resolution supporting the Federal Government's recently announced gun control proposals. North Halton Contact Centre is a member of the Ontario Association.

At the OATDC Spring conference, held from May 13-15 and hosted by the Guelph Distress Centre, delegates from 21 telephone distress centres across Ontario approved a conference resolution expressing support for the gun control proposals of Bill C-51.

The proposed amendments to the Criminal Code are seen by the OATDC as an attempt to save the lives of some of the more than 1000 Canadians who each year use a firearm

to commit suicide. The telephone distress centres have a direct interest in the prevention of suicide since many of the individuals who use the service they provide are in a suicidal or near suicidal state of mind, and an actual suicide attempt is often precipitated by the availability of a means. In this respect firearms are the most often used and most lethal means of committing suicide.

The OATDC pointed out that the gun control proposals currently before Parliament will make it more difficult for individuals to obtain a firearm by making it mandatory for new acquirers to first apply for a firearms acquisition certificate. Furthermore individuals who have a recent history of violent behaviour will not be issued a firearms

acquisition certificate.

Also of interest to the OATDC in terms of limiting access to firearms by individuals prone to suicide is the proposed criminal penalty for persons who do not store firearms in a safe manner. The proposed criminal sanction will hopefully encourage those persons who are close to a suicidal individual to keep their firearms safely locked away.

The OATDC feels the proposed legislation is not the final answer to the tragedy of firearms suicide, but it is seen as an attempt to control the currently easy availability of household rifles and shotguns, the most common weapons used in firearms suicide.

New firm at Domtar?

There appears to be an excellent chance the closed Domtar plant will be sold by June and a firm moving in, which will eventually employ 850 workers, Mayor Tom Hill said in an interview this week.

Hill said he could not divulge the name of the company or give any information about what they make.

He, along with planner Mario Venditti and Councillor Peter Pomeroy, met Friday morning with top officials of the mystery firm and toured Domtar.

Hill said he expects a deal for purchase of the property to be completed by June if the company finds everything with respect to the property and other items satisfactory.

He explained the firm interested in moving into Domtar has its own engineers going over the plant and is now awaiting a final report from them.

"I feel there is a good chance the deal will go through," Hill declared.

He said initially the firm expects to employ 150 to 200 workers but as expansion takes place over a number of years the eventual work force could total as many as 850.

Domtar closed down at the end of March throwing 176 people out of work.
