

# Day long festival showcases singers

There were many winners at the North Halton Music Festival but the biggest winners were the hundreds of children who had the opportunity of participating.

Children from grades one to eight participated in the day-long event held at M. Z. Bennett School in Acton Tuesday May 17.

The awards were well spread through all the schools participating. Robert Little School, M. Z. Bennett School (both of Acton), Harrison School and Georgetown Christian School from Georgetown all won two firsts.

Other firsts went to Glen Williams School, Percy W. Merry School, Drumquin, Brookville and Martin St. School, Milton.

Students from Robert Little School won the first award of the day for their singing in the triple duet class. They sang Queen Summer. Second in that class was Georgetown Christian School.

Harrison School's Primary Choir and Junlor Choir picked

up the silverware in their categories. The primary choir narrowly won over M.Z. Bennett, Brookville and Robert Little, singing Lady May.

The Shell was the song sung in the junior choir competition. Placing second was Brookville and third Robert Little.

The singing of My Best Color won Glen Williams their first place. Their primary choir ran a close first ahead of W.I. Dick and Howard Wrigglesworth Schools.

The Junlor Choir and Triple Duet from Georgetown Christian School won their categories. To win the Junior Choir class they sang Down Where the Rapids Dance and defeated Howard Wrigglesworth and W.I. Dick School choirs. The Triple Duet group defeated a Howard Wrigglesworth School choir for their win. The song they sang was Song of Spring.

M.Z. Bennett School captured top honors in the Boys' Unchanged Voices category

as well as the Triple Trio category. Singing The Mermaid, the boys won over Brookville and Percy W. Merry for the title. The Triple Trio group narrowly defeated two choirs from Martin St. School, to win the silverware. They sang My Love's an Arbutus.

The Intermediate Choir from Percy W. Merry School won its category defeating Brookville, M.Z. Bennett and Joseph Gibbons School choirs. The World is Full of Beauty was the song they sang along with a song of their choice.

Singing the Bay of Biscay the Brookville Boys' Changed Voices Choir won their class.

The Martin St. School Senior Choir won its class, singing Spring. They defeated Brookville for the win.

The Robert Little School Senior Choir, singing Aura Lee and a song of their choice, defeated Martin St. School's choir.
