**Suggests study  
of town operation**

Councillor Peter Morris wants to have a management study of the town's operation done by consultants. Halton Hills finance-administration committee was not enthusiastic, but went along as far as having the clerk-administrator contact consultants with management experience, and have them submit a precis of their accomplishments. Morris said he felt an outside consultant should be used, because neither council nor staff are qualified in the management field, and are too close to the problem, and naturally have some bias. He said he was hoping for clear concise recommendations to increase the efficiency of the operation. Councillor Peter Marks asked how much money he was talking about. Morris said he had no idea, but would simply call tenders if council agreed to the study. Councillor Pat Patterson said "I've been through many wrecking crews". He said he actually favored the study as long as it wasn't interpreted as criticism of present department heads. Councillor Walter Biehn asked if Ministry of Municipal Affairs has anyone who gives help of this kind. He was told there was none in that capacity.

Pallbearers were all grandsons: David McMullen, Danny McLean, Gerry McMullen, John McMullen, Steven Mellor and Bryan Robinson. Interment was in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown.
