It's already started! Yes, another golf season is upon us here in Halton. It's time to bring out the clubs you supposedly cleaned and waxed last fall and "putter" around the course, "ironing" out any problems you had last year, just like any good golfer "wood" do.

Here's a list of some of the area golf courses where many duffers will be frustrated, where many balls will be lost and where some golf clubs may find themselves among the trout, the perch, the crayfish and the reeds.

ACTON MEADOWS
Semi-private
The 2,836 yard par-35 course is located just north of Highway 7, 1 1/4 miles west of Acton. It costs \$4 weekdays and \$5 weekends. For more information phone 853-0631.

GUELPH COUNTRY CLUB
Private
This nine hole 3,027 yard course is located in Guelph on Waverly Drive. For more information call 824-2741.

ERIN HEIGHTS GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB
Semi-private
This nine hole 3,015 course is located off Highway 24 in the village of Erin. It costs \$5

weekdays and \$6 for Saturdays, Sundays and holidays if you want to play 18 holes. For nine holes the fees are \$3 and \$4. For more information call 833-9702.

NORTH HALTON GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB
Private
The 6,400 yard course is located on the corner of Trafalgar Rd. and Maple Avenue in Georgetown. For more information phone 877-3363.

GEORGETOWN
Semi-private
The 6,140 yard par-71 course is located north of Georgetown. It costs \$6 weekdays, \$4 after 5 p.m., \$8 weekends, \$6 after 4 p.m. For more information phone 878-6011.

TRAFALGAR GOLF CLUB
Private
The 6,505 yard par-71 course is located on the corner of Derry Rd. and Sixth Line. For more information phone 878-2303.

HORNBY TOWER
Public
The 6,740 yard par-72 course is located on Trafalgar Rd. about 1/4 mile north of Steeles Ave. It costs \$5 weekdays and \$7 weekends or \$5 after 3 p.m. To contact Hornby Towers phone 878-3421.

HALTON COUNTRY INN
Semi-private
The 2,945 yard course is a par-36 and is located off the Sixth Line north of Five Sideroad in Milton. It costs \$4 weekdays and \$6 on weekends. For more information phone 878-6701.

LOWVILLE HEIGHTS
Public
The 5,900 yard, par-71 course is located at Britannia Rd. and Guelph Line. It costs \$6 weekdays and weekends. Weekday evenings cost \$3 and weekend evenings cost \$4. For more information phone 335-6181.

VICTORIA PARK GOLF CLUB
Semi-private
There are two courses here, a 6,400 yard par 71 course and a 3,600 par 61 course. Club house and catering facilities are licensed by the LLBO. Courses are located at Victoria Road South and Arkel Road. For fee information call 821-2211.

WYLDWOOD GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB
Private
The 6,300 yard par-70 course is located on Trafalgar Rd. at Drumquin, five miles north of Highway 5. For more information phone 878-4848.

GLEN ABBEY GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB
Semi-private
The new home of the Canadian Open is located on the North Service Road, west of Kerr St. in Oakville. To play on the 7,240-yard, par-72 course costs \$25 weekdays, weekends and holidays. LIDO GOLF CENTRE
Semi-private
The course that Vic Hadfield built is located on the South Service Rd. in Oakville. To play the 4,620-yard par-64 course costs \$5.50 weekdays, \$3 after 6 p.m., \$7 weekends, \$5.50 after 4 p.m. The miniature golf course costs adults \$1.50 and children \$1 to play. RICHBVIEW GOLF AND COUNTRY
Semi-private
