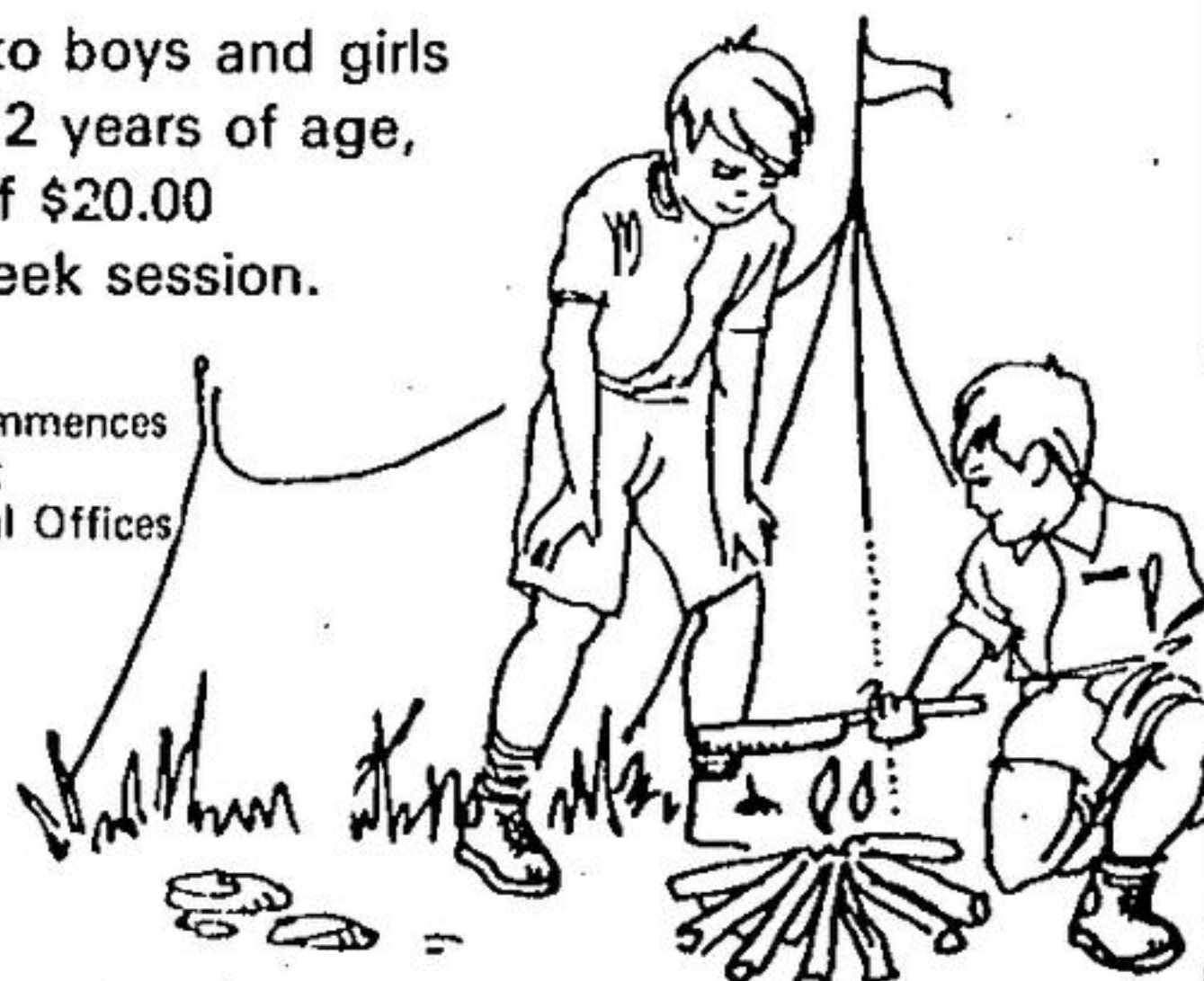
## Adventure Camp '77
