Century old link?

The discovery of a century old document in an old family Bible has led a Sarnia man to wonder if any of his relatives come from this area.

Gary P. Welsh, a lab technologist with Esso Chemical Canada, brought a receipt for a subscription to the Acton Free Press to the paper's office. The beige colored piece of paper was made out to Mr. Jas. Lighthouse of Petrolia. The paper is dated May 9, 1877. Jas. Lighthouse is Mr.

Welsh's great, great maternal grandfather.

Mr. Welsh is working for a couple of days this week at Building Products, and came into the paper's office with the hand size receipt.

The price for the Free Press in the 1870s is stated on the paper as \$1, if paid in advance, \$1.50 in six months and \$2 at the end of the year.

Mr. Welsh's address in Sarnia is Esso Chemical Canada, P.O. Box 69, N7T 7H8.

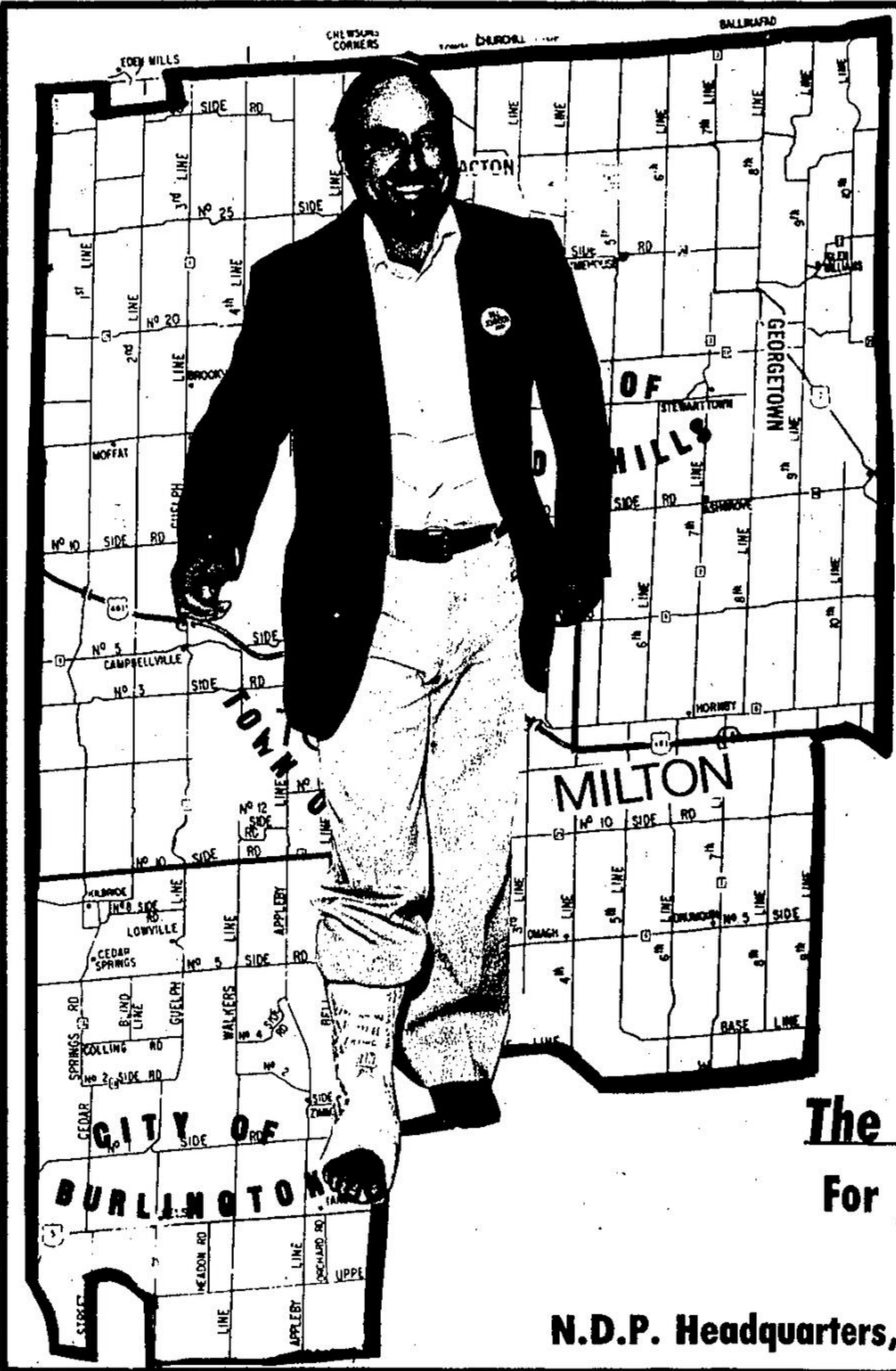
