Last season, while he was still midget age, Brian tended goal for the Markham Waxers of the Tier 2 Provincial Junior "A" League. He was named to the league's east division all-star team.

A Grade 12 student at Georgetown District High, Brian is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Norm Hayward, Dandridge Crescent.

Six players, including four from the Burlington Cougars, were picked off the rosters of OHA Central Junior "B" teams. London picked Burlington defenceman Bob Goodish in the second round, Rick Lanz of Burlington went to Oshawa in the third round, Glen Duncan of Burlington to Toronto Marlboros in the third round and winger Kevin Charbonneau, also of the Cougars,

Although there were no graduates of the Georgetown minor hockey system drafted, Major Junior "A" clubs apparently agree with the experts who select individual award winners at the annual Georgetown International Bantam Tournament. Three players who have won awards at the tournament within the past two years, were drafted. They are, Dave Hannan of Levaack midgets, most gentlemanly player at eh '75-76 tourney, Dan Gunning of Burlington midgets, outstanding goalie at the '74-75 tournament and Goodish, who won the award for the player best combining ability and sportsmanship in the '74-75 event. Hannan was the third round pick of the Windsor Spitfires. Gunning went to Cornwall, which plays in the Quebec League, in the sixth round.

Of interest to hockey fans in Acton, was the second round selection of the Simcoe Junior "B" club's Norm Stefan. Stefan, then playing hockey in Delhi, singlehandedly eliminated the Acton novice team from the OMAHA zone playoffs in 1971 by scoring 13 goals in a playoff series.

Check your proof of enumeration, Form 103, for the address of your polling place.

On the wall of each polling place, directions for marking your ballot will be in plain view. If you have any other questions, ask the person who gives you your ballot. Vote by marking only the circle after the candidate's name of your choice.
