Milton council decided to build a new arena, over the protests of more than 200 citizens who attended the decision making meeting.

Protesters wanted an arena, which had been closed by provincial order, to be repaired.

The new arena will be built beside the high school. Some of the protesters just wanted the 55-year old former arena fixed up.

The province said it could not safely hold snow. Other protesters, near the new site, were concerned about the increase of traffic. Council gave the \$561,000 to a Brampton firm.
