The Lionettes originally. formed to cater to the Lions at their dinners but they have been an independent body with their own source of income since February of 1972.



## Phones face rate boost

Bell Canada subscribers in the Rockwood telephone exchange will soon face a slight increase in their monthly phone bills, ranging from 20 to 40 cents a month.

Oakville-Milton manager William C. Barnes appeared before a meeting of Milton Council Monday to explain why Rockwood phones are going to cost more. The current rate level in the Rockwood exchange is group 7, which allows free calling to up to 35,000 other customers, he said. But local customers can call 37,276 phones for free now, and this means moving into rate group 8, Barnes said.

A private line will rise from \$5.95 per month, by 40 cents. Two-party phones will cost 20 cents more, and multi-party phones 35 cents more, he said.






