Another extension of 'all systems go' date

Rockwood residents will have sewers and water service this winter, according to the Ministry of Environment. Allan Patterson, of the Ministry, told Eramosa township council Monday evening that the Rockwood project is considered "extremely important" and is on top of the priority list. He admitted, however, the project would not be ready by the end of October, when it was expected to be done. He said the end of November was closer to the proper date, but told the council to condition themselves to a spring turn-on date.

Councillor Dave Masson asked Mr. Patterson if householders could not dig the trenches necessary for the hookups and bring the pipes into the house, now and save a last-minute boom once the system is completed. The Ministry representative said this could not be done as no connections were allowed until the sewer and water system was fully completed and tested.

Mr. Patterson said the hold

up in the construction is in the laying of the pipe which is to take the sewage from Rockwood to the Guelph treatment plant, which is to be installed at the same time Highway 7 is being reconstructed. He also pointed out that a pre-treatment plant still has to be built. Mr. Patterson said there is a possibility that work could be started, and a severe winter begins, and all work would have to halt. "Because of these things, do not condition yourselves to everything by the end of October," he told the council. Councillor John McLeod said he agreed with a spring deadline and admitted when first told all systems would be go by December, he wondered what year. "You have to be realistic," he said. Reeve Bill Adsett wondered about the possibility of just connecting the water to each house, but Mr. McLeod pointed out if the residents have one service, they will want the other. Mr. Patterson explained also that it would be costly for the homeowner to have to dig twice to make

the two hook-ups. The Ministry representative also said nine months was generally the amount of time homeowners had to get hooked up to the system, after the completion date. Mr. Masson said he did not think this was fair because of the shortage of contractors. Mr. McLeod pointed out that the sewer and water work was almost completed, and the system have been there for a year, yet would not be useable until 1978. He stressed great inconvenience to the village residents. "If it had been one or two months of people having well and water problems, they might not have minded, but if people have to pay thousands of dollars to fix something, and then in the spring have to pay for the hookup of the system, it is not fair."

Another meeting with the Ministry of Environment was scheduled for early August, hopefully after highway reconstruction has commenced. Mr. Patterson admitted to the council that the Rockwood project was the worst scheduled one he had ever seen. Those who have problems which cannot be alleviated should be allowed to hook up to the water, according to Mr. Masson. Mr. Patterson, how-
