Evangelist says
Trudeau, Clark should resign
 The founder and President of the Renaissance movement, Canadian evangelist Ken Campbell called for the resignations of both Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau and the leader of the Opposition, Joe Clark in three letters to Governor-General Jules Léger, and the Presidents of the National Progressive Conservative and Liberal parties.
 Mr. Campbell felt the prime minister should step down in order to mend his broken home.
 In his letter to the President of the Liberal Party he commented, "May I suggest, with respect sir, that our Prime Minister could make the greatest contribution toward realization of his burning life's ambition to see a dynamic united Canada, by resigning from the Prime Ministership to fulfill the more basic responsibility of building an exemplary happy home. Only on the foundation of such homes can a society be built in God's blessing."
 Mr. Campbell chastised Margaret Trudeau for her "escape" from marriage. "If this is liberation, God have mercy on the next generation."
 In the letter to the President of the Progressive Conservatives Mr. Campbell said Joe Clark and his wife, Maureen McTeer, were setting a destructive example for the youth of the nation.
 He said the determination of Ms. McTeer to keep her maiden name suggested her unwillingness to leave her father.
 Speaking on what he called proven superiority of the tried and true traditional values of our Judeo-Christian heritage on which the Fathers of Confederation sought to build a nation Mr. Campbell wondered how Mr. Clarke and Ms. McTeer could demonstrate scorn for those values in going to build a home and be trusted with the responsibilities of building a nation.

Parent removes children from school

A Limehouse area resident who finds the "prevailing humanism in the public schools unpalatable" has decided to take his two children out of Limehouse school and send them to Georgetown District Christian School next year.
 Mr. Loveless, R.R. 1 Limehouse, sent copies of a letter he sent to Limehouse principal Ron Beckett, to Chairman Garry Morton and Trustee Bert Hinton, Halton Board of Education, Halton-Burlington MPP Julian Reed, and Education Minister Tom Wells. His letter was received by the board, Thursday.
 Mr. Loveless made it clear he isn't blaming the principal or staff of Limehouse school and in fact commends the teachers on an excellent job.
 "Our concern centres upon the philosophy of the educational system, and the attitudes and moral values which are a logical consequence of that philosophy," Loveless declared.
