Will appeal OMB decision

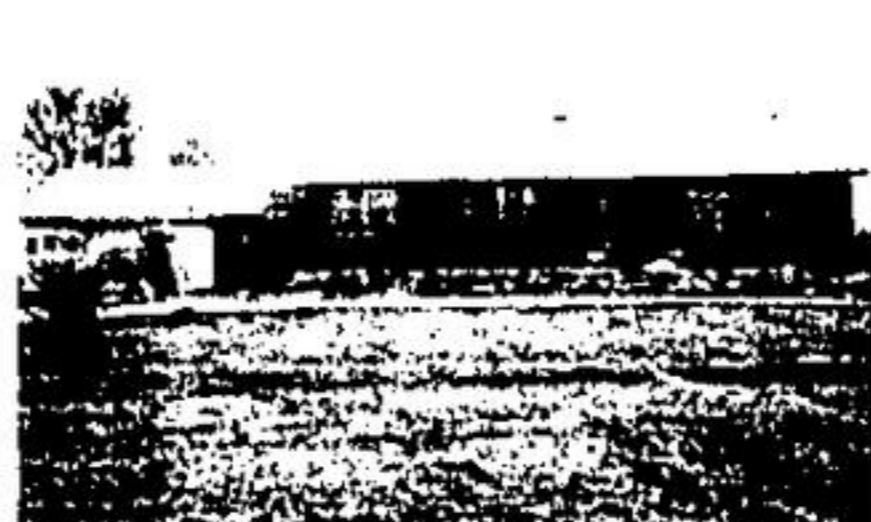
