Regular tickets, if bought for each game, would total about \$36, according to Campbell while the team hopes to "come in under \$20" for a season ticket.

Ouite a bit "We hope to raise quite a bit from the ticket sales," said Campbell. The team is aiming to sell 1,000 of them, which would cover most of the expenses of the team. The rest of the cost of running a Junior B team would be borne by advertising revenue from the programs.
