Brian Best dies in Milton

Brian Best, former mayor of Milton, died at Milton District Hospital, August 1, never regaining consciousness following an accident September 9, 1974. He was involved in a two car collision on Britannia Rd. then and it caused serious brain damage and subsequent coma.

Mr. Best was well known during his term of office as mayor of Milton. His untiring work, and astute decisions shaped the town of Milton's destiny. He retired from public life nine months before the accident.

Prior to taking the mayor's chair he had served on the Milton school board, Chamber of Commerce and ratepayers' associations. He was also a successful businessman, operating Best Real Estate.

SHARE cattle to Brazil

Final plans are being completed for shipment of 30 Holstein Friesian heifers and 3 bulls to Mossoro, Brazil under the auspices of S.H.A.R.E. Agriculture Foundation.

The cattle were assembled at Rockwood International Farms, Georgetown last weekend and will be shipped out on either Wednesday, August 3 or Thursday August 4 by truck transport via Port Huron to Miami for transshipment by air to Fortaleza, Brazil.

Mr. and Mrs. Hugh Beaty of Milton, Ontario left on July 22 by air for Brazil and will be present at the Fortaleza Airport to assist at the time of the arrival of the cattle and to commence their work on the project in co-operation with the Mossoro School.

This is the first project of the S.H.A.R.E. Foundation which was incorporated in December 1976.

Coyotes slay 461 turkeys

461 turkeys have been killed by coyotes on a Ferguson poultry farm.

Ministry of Natural Resources officials and the farmer believe the deaths are the results of a mother coyote teaching its young how to hunt. Fifty-two birds were felled

in one night. A trapper has been called in to stop the carnage.

The farm normally has some 55,000 birds.

The farmer, Jack Walkey, applied to West Gatafraxa township for \$1,152.50 in compensation.
