Car leaves road smashes home

The veranda of an Acton estimated the damage to the home was badly damaged Sunday afternoon when it was struck by a car travelling eastbound on Young St.

"I didn't see it but I sure heard it," said Jim Brydon, the retired 70-year-old Acton man who lives in the damaged home at 14 Young

"Yes, I sure heard it," the retired Town of Georgetown employee said. "When it hit the front of my house I must have jumped about two feet out of my chair."

The accident occurred Raymond Kingsmill, 94 Long- paving. field, driving a Camaro, came around the Mill St .-Young St. turn. Mr. Brydon's home is located on the west side of Young St. and Kingsmill allegedly collided with the house when he came through the turn.

"I usually sit in the veranda in the summertime," Mr. Brydon said. "But there were a few sprinkles of rain coming down so I went to the back of the house to close the windows and shut the doors. I came into the living room, which opens up to the veranda, and sat with my back to the street. That's when it happened."

The veranda has been knocked about six inches off its foundations, the aluminum siding has been hent from roof to floor, the windows are broken and no longer square and the baseboards in the front of the living room and bedroom have been chipped and cracked.


About 14 house plants have been destroyed and Brydon placed a value on them of over \$5 a piece.

However, the irreparable damage comes in the form of the vases that held the plants and the china and small pottery trinkets that sat in the windows of the house, and were smashed.

"Some of the pottery and vases belonged to my grandmother," Mr. Brydon said. "The other trinkets have sentimental value because they belonged to my wife. She died about nine years ago in a train crash near here.

equal number of portables. The separate board named a two-member committee to meet the regional director of education on the matter.


