Jelinek may not run in Halton

A few weeks ago Otto Jelinek was certain that he would be seeking the Tory nomination in Halton, but now it is all up in the air.

In a recent interview Jelinek said he had been contacted by party executives in Ottawa and by Party Leader made with a view to persuading Jelinek to run in Toronto instead of Halton.

White Jelinek said he probably wouldn't make a decision until the spring, he did say he was a party man and would probably go where the party felt he could serve best.


