## Long term care a regional issue

A request to build a 100-bed nursing home in Georgetown would have been turned down by the Ministry of Health even if the Halton District Health Council had recommended it, Health Council Chairman Terrence Baines said. He said the ministry's policy was to build no new nursing homes in the province.

"The scheme on the surface has a great deal of appeal," Mr. Baines commented. Plans called for the nursing home to be situated on the grounds of the Georgetown hospital and to share the hospital's service facilities, such as the kitchen. A private builder would provide funds for construction, Mr. Baines said.

Council has set up a subcommittee to study the issue.
