

MS third in cross-country

The annual cross country meet for North Halton schools ended strangely Friday at Kelso Conservation Park.

Two schools, Martin St. of Milton and Centennial of Georgetown tied for the senior honors. Both teams had girl runners tallying 25 points and the boys at 29 points for a total of 53. Normally a tie would be broken by the placing of the school's fifth place runner.

Tabulators took both boy and girl fifth place finisher for each school, totalled the points, and they were still tied.

In the school placings for the four age categories, Joseph Gibbons School of Georgetown placed first with 158 points, Centennial of Georgetown second with 162 points and McKenzie-Smith Middle School of Acton third with 167 points.

In the senior placings, Tina Pantor of Martin St. placed first in a time of 6:05. Team-mate Jackie Llewellyn, 6:12, was second and Leslie Pritchard of Centennial third, recording 6:22.

In the boys' race Barton Veinott of Martin St. was first in a time of 7:20 over the mile-and-a-half course. Allan Cunningham of Stewarttown was second with 7:28 and Andrew Brakel, also of Stewarttown was third at 7:34.

Stewarttown School took the top junior honors with 67 points, Centennial was second with 98 and Martin St. of Milton third with 112.

Centennial topped the intermediate class with 47 points followed by Milton's Martin St. with 69 points and Stewarttown third with 81.

In senior, Stewarttown placed third with 80 points while Centennial and Martin St. tied for first.

The race was originally scheduled for Wednesday, Oct. 12 but was cancelled and moved to Friday. The cool winds and wet grass soon changed by mid morning and traces of sunshine could be caught between runners' breaths.

The course started at the small ski hill and circled around along to the beach area. Runners followed the S curve from the beach, along the ridge that overlooks it, and down the finish stretch by the wooden buildings.

Intermediate, individual winners included Mark Ezart of Stewarttown placing first in the boys' race with a time of 5:10. Kevin Gillespie, also Stewarttown, was second with a 5:19 time while M. Wroplewski of Centennial was third. Intermediate girls' winner was Cheryl Thompson of Centennial who ran the course in 6:16. Denise Worth of Martin St. placed second in 6:17 while Cathy Webb of Centennial followed in third with an equal time of 6:17.

K. Marino of Martin St. junior boys crossed the finish line after a six minute and 25 second run for first place. Gary Hubert of Stewarttown was second with 6:27 and Ian Paul of McKenzie Smith Middle School third with a time of 6:30.

Junior girls' winner was Barbara Gage of Stewarttown with 6:39. Ange Dickenson and teammate Tracey English, both of Stewarttown, placed second and third with times of 6:49 and 6:51, respectively.

In the bantam division Scott Taggart of Centennial hit the wire first after completing the round in 6:10. He

was followed by Centennial runners Glenn Blight and Darren Kemp who posted times of 6:14 and 6:21. Caputo and Faulkner of

J.M. Denyes School Milton were first and second in bantam girls with times of 8:08 and 8:13. Sandra Headon of Pineview was third with 8:18.
