Halton trustees reviewed the increasing use of auxiliary personnel or para-professionals in schools at Thursday's board meeting.

Differentiated staffing allows schools to use money for teacher's salaries to hire auxiliary personnel. The practise began as an experiment in 1971 and has become increasingly common. Where a school might be assigned 30.4 teachers because of the pupil-teacher ratio the teacher is replaced with a para-professional who might work in the library or be a teacher's ald.
