

Eighth annual show Saturday for Acton Arts and Crafts group

Their eighth annual display and sale was held Saturday by the members of Acton Arts and Crafts group. Tables of ingeniously crafted articles were arranged upstairs, while coffee tables filled the basement room of the parish hall.

An original member of the group, Sisko Kockx was back at the show this year. She had left the group when she became too busy at the Fourth Line flower shop.

Others exhibiting were Laura Dittrich, Jean Weir, Jean Denny, Del Howse, Elisabeth Gathof and Florence Wilkin.

Innovations joined traditional crafts on their tables, pleasing many buyers.

Mrs. Dittrich has a new series of drawings of old town

churches, including St. Joseph's, Knox, St. Alban's and the Baptist church. She was selling these as framed prints and hand-notes. Mrs. Dittrich also featured batik and paintings.

Jean Denny's specialty is weaving, and she displayed some of her most popular items, ponchos, stoles and scarves. Her husband Jack had made baskets which were for sale.

Mrs. Weir does intriguing decoupage. Del Howse, with husband Ed, had a large display of beautifully finished ceramics.

Florence Wilkin is a talented weaver; also attractive were her fluffy flowers made of wool.

Mrs. Kockx enjoys making dried flower bouquets and macrame, as well as felt articles and amusing tree decorations.

Mrs. Gathof is always designing new articles, which she decorates with wood-burning. They range from letter openers to lamp bases.

Obituary

Elderly member of St. Joseph's

On September 28 Elizabeth Phillips died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Guelph, in her 87th year after a brief illness.

Mrs. Phillips was borne in Esquesing township on August 20, 1891. She was the daughter of Michael Kaley and Nancy Hiltz. As the last surviving member of the Kaley family, Mrs. Phillips was predeceased by brothers Philip, James, Michael, John, Joseph and Peter and sisters Annie, Mary, and Margaret.

In June 1919, she married Emery Phillips and moved to Frederick Street where they resided until his death in 1949. In 1968, Mrs. Phillips moved to Church St. She was a member of the Catholic Women's League, and was one of the oldest members of St. Joseph's parish. She was also active in the community until suffering a broken hip last March. Consequently, she was confined to St. Joseph's hospital where she received excellent care and enjoyed the visits of her many friends and relatives.

Funeral arrangements were conducted by the Shoemaker Funeral Home. Father J. Smye officiated at the funeral mass on October 1.

Region puts hold on town industrial park

Approval of a rezoning for a 1,400 acre industrial park in Milton north of Highway 401 was deferred Wednesday after Regional Council's Public Works Chairman Jack Raftis called for yet another study concerning the development.

Members of the region's planning committee argued that Raftis' concerns were covered in conditions that went along with the committee approval.

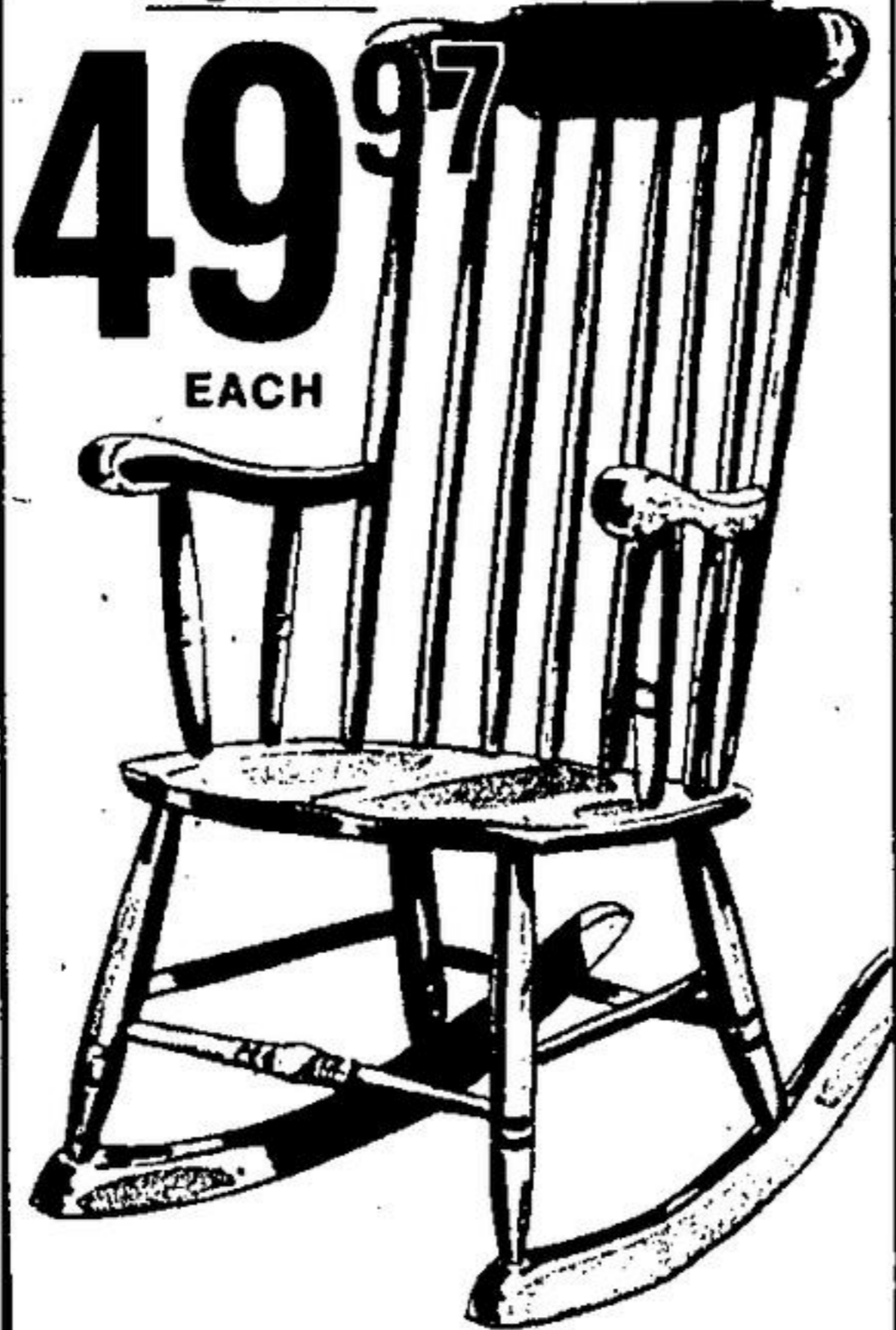
But Raftis told council the sewage plant currently under construction in Milton would only have capacity for 100 acres of industrial waste and the rest of the development would have to be serviced on

private sewage systems. He said that once the industries were built, they would pressure the region for permission to hook up to the municipal system.
