Acton teams take fourth, Hodgson top solo runner

Derek Hodgson was the top Acton finisher last Wednesday in the Halton cross-country meet at Kelso taking the seventh spot out of 117 finishers in the Midget boys race.

His finish led the Acton team to a ninth place in the event, out of 18 teams finishing the race.

Hodgson covered the 4000 meters in 15:25, less than a minute behind the leader. Four thousand meters is equivalent to about two and a half miles.

Martin Colleton, Bill McKenzie and Mark Cook and Gary Lumbers rounded out the list of Acton runners going the distance.

Georgetown won both the boys and girls overall categories, giving them the overall championship by a wide margin over Bramalea.

Best team finished for the Acton runners came in the junior girls 3000 metres and the junior boys 5600 metres. Both squads finished fourth overall thanks to good team performances.

Lillian Graham and Sharon Cook topped the junior girls, placing 16th and 19th overall in a race which saw 93 finishers. Angela Buschowski and Patsy Kelly were Acton's

other two point getters in the race.

Strong race
Ted Nadhazi ran another strong race for the junior boys to head Acton's evenly matched crew to the finish line. All four runners finished within twenty places of each other in the biggest race of the day, with 138 finishers.

Nadhazi was followed by Gord Amphlett, Nevel Porter and David Johnson.

Acton did not field a full team in the midget girls event, as Sherri Halliday and Connie McCristal were their only finishers. There were no Acton finishers in the senior girls 4000 metres.

Henry Kroezen, Rick Widmont and Chris Kalnz were the only three Acton runners to finish the senior boys 7200 metres.

Rezone dragway for estate homes

Waples tops \$700,000 for new O.J.C. record

Rockwood's Ron Waples became the first driver in the history of the Ontario Jockey Club harness racing circuit to surpass the \$700,000 mark in season's purse earnings when he drove the pacer, Miss Bonnie Sue to victory in Sunday night's eighth race at Mohawk Raceway.

The 33-year-old Waples, who took over the circuit's number one spot in the dollar dash from perennial leader Ron Feagan during this meeting, went over the \$700,000 plateau with the \$2,500 share of the \$5,000 purse the four-year-old mare Miss Bonnie Sue picked up for trainer and owner Ernie Spruce.

Feagan, who has been the circuit's top purse earner in the past five seasons, held the former record of \$699,228 that he established in the '75 season.

Waples formed his own stable six years ago after serving his racing apprenticeship under his famous cousin Keith Waples. He hit the latest milestone on a particularly good evening. He earlier won the fourth race with Kawartha Park; was

second with Senor Skipper in the evening's feature; finished fifth with Aaron Tarfrost in the seventh, a result that put him just \$727 away from the \$700,000 mark.

Miss Bonnie Sue brought him over that sum and Armbro Ontario added \$1,900 when Waples steered that pacer to victory in the ninth race. In the nightcap he was

third with Pub.

The three wins boosted his season's total to 192 and he trails leading Ron Feagan by 13 victories on the circuit. Feagan ranks second in the money standings with \$642,000.

In the latest North American driver standings Feagan ranks fourth while Waples is in sixth position.

Last Thursday the girls' field hockey team took on the teachers at Brookville. The score turned out to be a tie at 2-2.

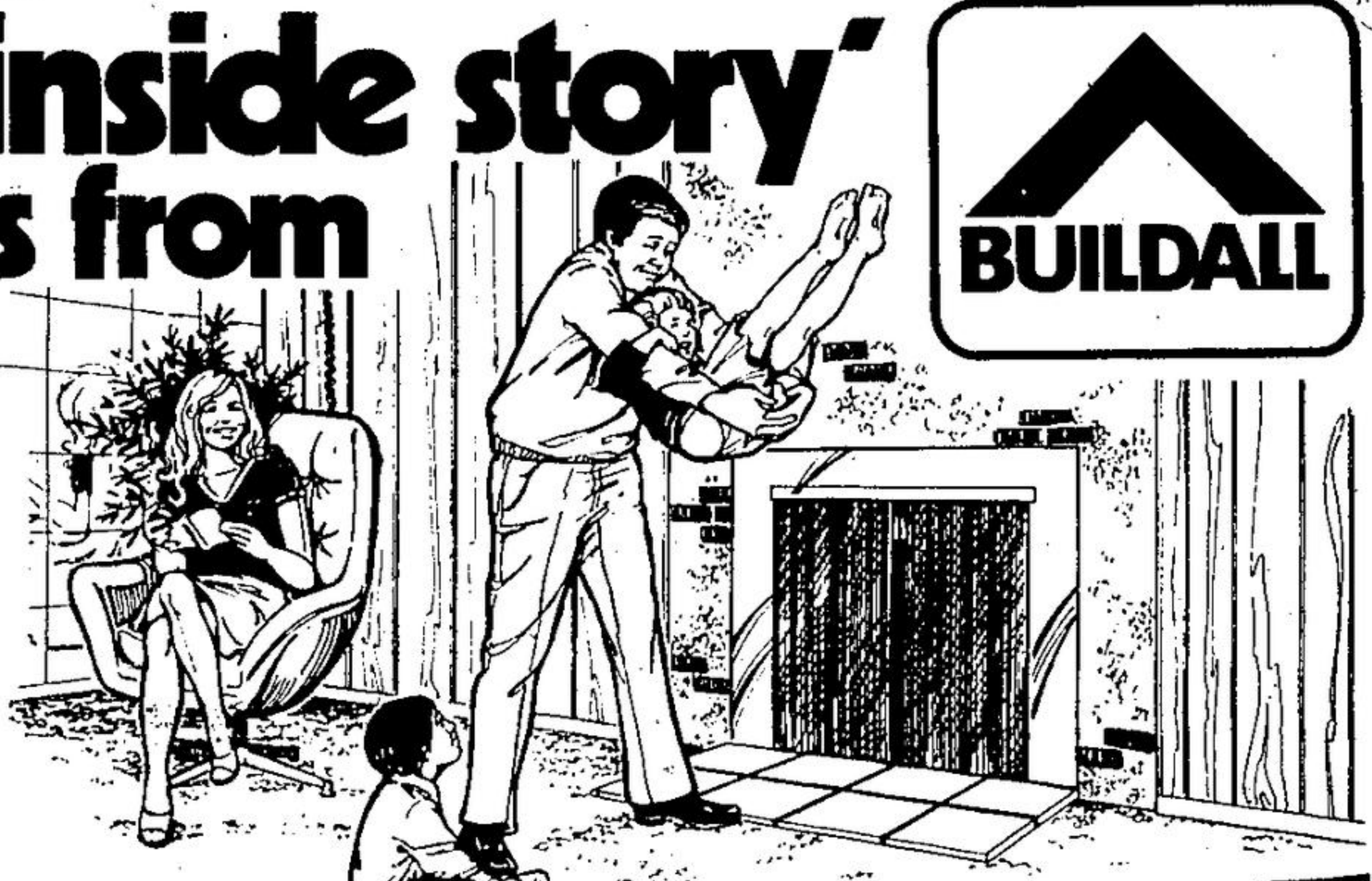
The teachers' goals were by Mrs. Howden, assisted by Mr. Dodd and by Mr. McKeown unassisted. The girls' goals
