Rebuilding tennis courts

Reconstruction of the Acton tennis courts is underway now as the old surface has been entirely ripped up and the fences and lights removed.

Cost of the renovations will be in the vicinity of \$32,500 of which \$13,000 will go for the new lights and the rest for the new surface and fences.

The surface being used is an emulsion penetration type, according to Anne Pickering. recreation co-ordinator for Acton, and when finished the courts will be exactly the same as those at Gordon Alcott in Georgetown, but with an extra 10 feet inside for seating.

The tennis club is contributing about \$2,500 towards the seating area and for extra candlepower in the lighting, according to Miss Pickering.
