# Safer snowmobiling starts with a driver training course.

through the Driver Training Course offered by the Ontario Federation of Snowmobile Clubs (OFSC) in conjunction with the Ontario Safety League and your Ontario Ministry of Transportation and Communications.

The course is designed for

youngsters aged 12 to 15 and persons 16 and over who don't have an Ontario Motor Vehicle Driver's License. Graduates receive a proficiency certificate that must be validated as a snowmobile operator's license at any MTC driver examination centre for a \$2.00 fee.


