Region supports ICG fight

Halt Regional Council will continue to support the Interested Citizens' Group opposing a north-south route for the 500 kV hydro line running through Milton and Halton Hills.

The region withdrew opposition to the east-west route but will continue to oppose the use of hydro towers instead of poles.

The decision followed a presentation by John Minns of Georgetown, member of the ICG. Minns asked that the region be represented at the

Ontario hearings. He told the region that the ICG continues to press the Ontario Government for an independent study. Minns said the position of the ICG is that the route preferred by the government should be subjected to the same type of independent study that other areas of the route have been.

The Bruce to Milton route is the least desirable of the options open to Ontario Hydro the ICG says. He said Ontario Hydro's first choice was to take the route to Kitchener but that was abandoned when farmers along the route threatened to blow up towers and shoot insulation off the wires.

No reaction to Mounties

The Mounties may always get their man, but they didn't get a resolution from Halton Hills council.

A request for an endorsement of a Pembroke council resolution stating they considered the Royal Canadian Mounted Police the finest in the world, was simply received and filed by town council.

No one commented, and the matter died.
