

Councillors seek boss for town

Halton Hills councillors are split on what they expect of their next clerk-administrator. A number want Doug Pritchard's replacement to be boss of all staff.

McKenzie said the report was fine as far as it went but there weren't enough details in the job description. He warned in a dispute a department head could squeeze out from under the authority of the clerk-administrator as the job description was written.

Mayor Tom Hill said the job description said the clerk-administrator will coordinate all department heads, chair department head meetings, set out budget directives and submit personnel reports to council.

McKenzie concluded by describing the job description as "vague". Councillor Peter Marks agreed the job description should be more specific and added part of the problem was the word co-ordinate means different things to different people.

Mayor Tom Hill said he interpreted co-ordinate as meaning the clerk-administrator would be the middle man between council and staff.

Armstrong invited all councillors to submit concerns regarding the job description to his committee, promising a meeting would be held soon.

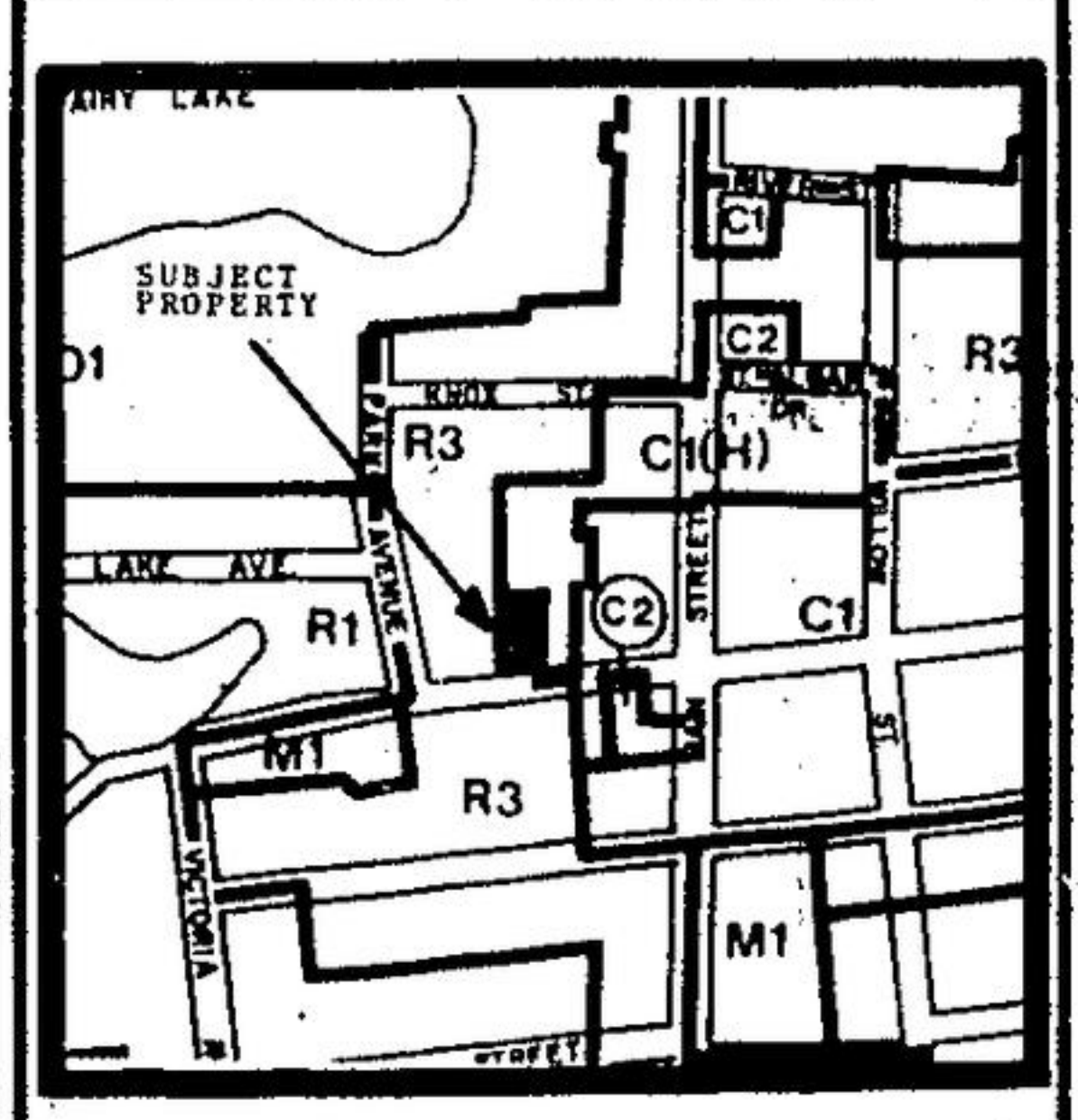
