## Gems beat '67-68 champs

Georgetown Gemini had to score three goals in the third period for a come from behind 6-4 exhibition victory over the 1967-68 OHA Junior "C" champion Georgetown Raiders in front of an Alcott Arena crowd of about 300 fans, Saturday night.

The special exhibition, which was held to raise funds for the financially-troubled Gems and to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the Raiders' championship win, proved that young legs will eventually overcome the experience of tired veterans, but that the vets never give up easily.

The junior Raiders, most of whom are in the 20-30 age category and no longer play hockey regularly, surprised their younger opponents by grabbing a 3-0 lead before the 10 minute mark of the first period. Gems tied the score in the second, but the '67-68 champs scored again early in the third period to put the pressure back on the Gemini.

"There are some good Junior 'B' hockey players today," said Gerry Inglis, coach of the '67-68 champs, "but they just don't have the enthusiasm anymore. Some of these guys haven't had skates on for six years and they still hated to lose."

Larry "Mouse" Bradley opened the scoring for the '67-68 vets on a pass from Kent Robinson at 5:24 of the first period. Dwayne Hay made it 2-0 with an unassisted goal at 6:42 and Ron Lane, who drove 250 miles from his home in Essex to play, converted passes from Hay and Jim Blair, making it 3-0 at 8:43.

The junior Raiders almost the put game out of reach, but a hard shot by Brent McMullen bounced off both goalposts and somehow stayed out of the net.

The young Gems got back in the game on markers by Chris Milne and Mark Eutenjeer before the first period ended.

The teams battled on even terms until the final minute of the second period when Doug Barnes, the all-time Gemini scoring leader, connected from Tony Giannini to tie the score 3-3.

An amazing rush by defenceman Phil Lavell, who hasn't been on blades for six years, set up the Raiders' go-ahead goal by Lane at 6:24 of the third period. Hay also assisted on the goal.

A minute later, Paul Ancinelli scored on a slapshot to tie the score and Gems won the game on goals by John Krasnokutsky at 9:26 and Dale Mieczanec in the final minute of play.

It was a very entertaining game, played by the book, except for a nasty incident in the third period when Gems' Terry Turner butt-ended Hay and was tossed out of the game by referee Fred Yates. The vets took eight of nine minor penalties handed out by Yates, as they checked tenaciously in an effort to win the game.

Kent Robinson, who organized the evening along with Tom James, Gems' vice-president, had all but three members of the '67-68 championship club on deck. Only Terry Hay, who now lives miles away in Terrace Bay, Bob Larmand and Terry Leswick were unable to make it.

Raiders dressed Dwayne Hay in place of his brother Terry and Jim Blair in place of Larmand. Dwayne was

called up from the Georgetown midget club for three games by the juniors during the '67-68 regular season.

Blair played with the outstanding '65-66 club, which finished as OHA semi-finalists, and the '66-67 club, which was eliminated by the Aurora Tigers. The Tiger lineup included present NHLers Jim Rutherford of Detroit and John Gould of Atlanta, as well as John Boyce, captain of the present intermediate "A" Chrysler Raiders.

Goalies Fred Cowbrough and Brian Peavoy were surprisingly sharp in the Raider nets. Neither plays hockey now.

Gemini President Bob Thompson said the evening was a financial and entertainment success.

"We'd like to thank Kent Robinson and the Junior 'C' champs for the effort they made," said Thompson. "It was the kind of community boost our club needs right now."

Fred Yates refereed the game. Steve McLellan and Gerry Perkins served as linesmen.

Five different players popped in markers for the pressmen in their final period.
