

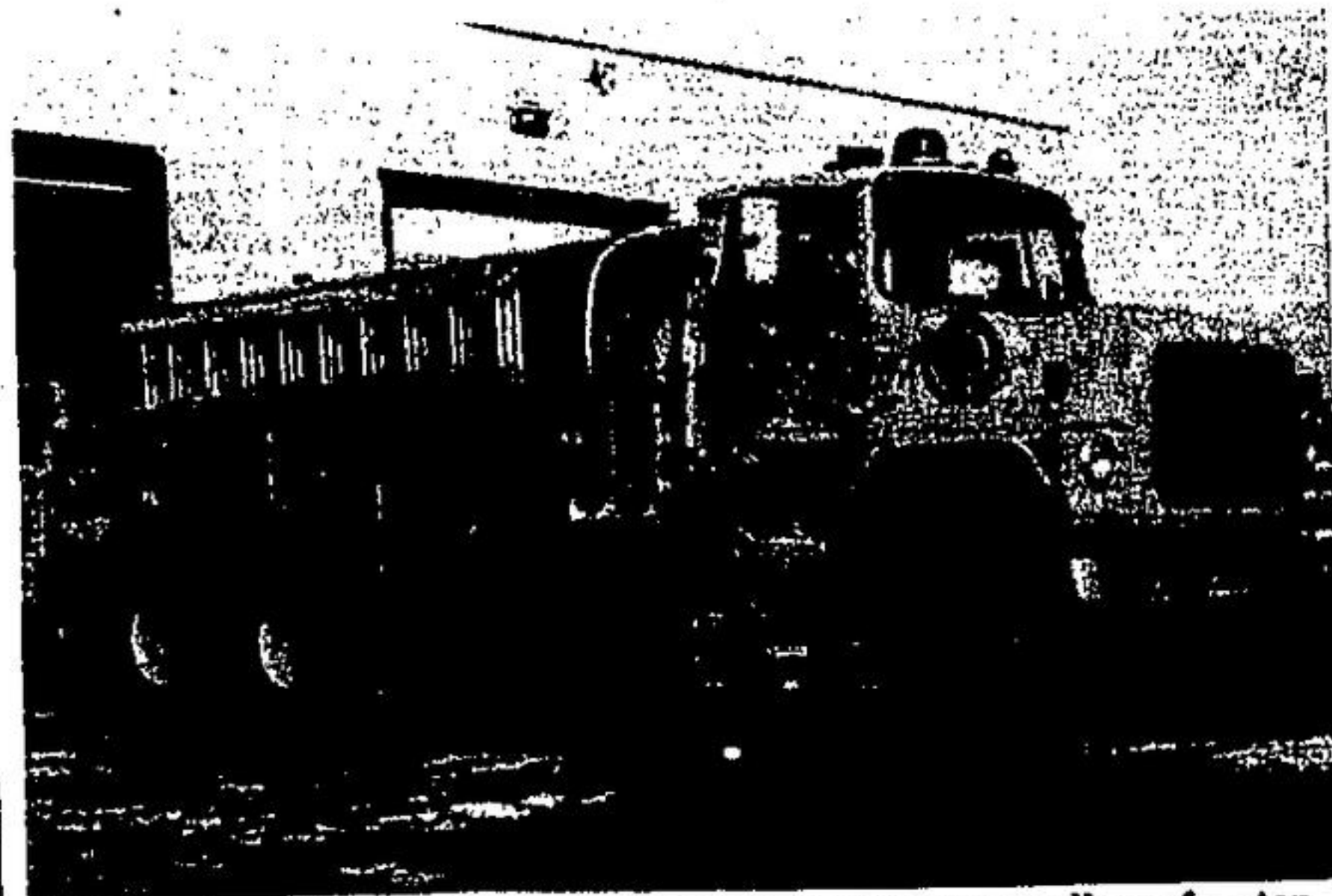

First diesel fire truck
Halton Hills will have its first diesel fire truck by late fall.
The combination fire truck, costing \$38,097, will come from King Seagrave, Woodstock. The 840 gallon pumper will seat three in the front and three in the back seat of the cab. It will be paid from this year's operating budget.

New \$39,000 tanker may be biggest

Halton Hills firefighters accepted delivery of a huge new \$39,064.32 tanker with a capacity of 2,500 gallons of water on Tuesday morning at the Area 2 (Georgetown) fire hall. The new tanker could be the biggest in the country. It will be used to fight rural fires primarily in Area 2 but will also be available for Acton firefighters in Area 1 should they need it.

Deputy Chief Bob Hyde said the tanker is a new concept and there is much interest in it from other fire departments. Most tankers have only a capacity of 500 to 1,500 gallons of water. The 2,500 gallon tanker will be especially helpful in fighting rural fires where water is a problem. It could be dispatched to a rural fire without pumps if necessary.

The tank and compartments on the truck are made of aluminum instead of the usual steel so the vehicle will be lighter and carry more water.

"Burlington fire department is especially interested in the new Halton Hills truck since they are building a new station at Kilbride, the deputy chief said. The aluminum is also rust free, ensuring it will last a good many years, hopefully 25 to 30, Hyde said.

Equipment on the vehicle includes a 1500 gallon portable tank which can be used to fight fires while the truck is getting more water.

Made by Mobile Tank Inc. (MTI) the tanker arrived nine days short of a year after being ordered. Firefighters have been waiting for it since last June. It takes only about three months to take delivery on a pumper but this vehicle was custom made for the Halton Hills firefighters.

Fire Chief Mick Holmes, Deputy Chief Bob Hyde, Safety Officer Larry Brassard and other firefighters were there to inspect the new tanker when it arrived. Later, Mayor Tom Hill arrived to inspect it and give it his seal of approval.

Dave McKee of Gallinger Motors, Milton, delivered the new vehicle which has a Ford chassis and a weight of 52,000 pounds fully loaded.

The tanker resembles a large milk truck drawing several comments from first viewers that it would look at home with a Drink Milk for Health sign on it. The vehicle is yellow now with aluminum tank and Fire Chief Mick Holmes says it will be painted to blend with other equipment.

The new vehicle joins four other pumps and a rescue van in the fire hall on Maple Ave. Halton Hills also has three pumps in Acton and the town hopes to get another tanker similar to the new one for the Acton fire hall which is in the process of reconstruction.

Obituary

Renowned auctioneer Roy Hindley, 94

Well known auctioneer and farmer William Roy Hindley died Sunday at the age of 94 in a nursing home at Palmerston where he had been recently.

Funeral services were held in the Shoemaker Funeral Home, Acton, yesterday. Temporary entombment is at Coningsby Mortuary. A spring burial will be at Everton.

Palbearers were Larry Cox, Brian Kee, Jack Holmes, Harvey Kirkwood, Gordon Hodwell and Jesse McEneaney.

Mr. Hindley was born on the family farm in Eramosa Township in 1884.

For about 49 years, until retirement in 1932, Roy Hindley was the district's leading agent. He sold at farm rings, chattel sales and church bazaars.

Mr. Hindley was predeceased by his wife Lillian Talbot in 1961. They lived for many years in a cottage at Everton. They were married in 1916.

That same year Mr. Hindley learned his trade in the Jones Auction School at Chicago.

During winters of the 1930s Mr. Hindley was a familiar sight with his horse and cutter as he went about his business.

For about five years after his wife's death, Mr. Hindley lived in Guelph.

Mr. Hindley's 90th birthday was celebrated by family and friends and fellow residents of the nursing home at Hillsburgh. Friends of two congregations remembered Mr. Hindley with gifts, cards and visits.

Mr. Hindley was a member of the Calvary Baptist Church at Guelph and the Church of Christ at Everton.

Mr. Hindley was predeceased by his two sisters, Mrs. John Campbell (Aunt Mable) of R.R. 4 Rockwood and Mrs. Elizabeth Dampier of Everton.
