Third candidate will seek PC nomination

A third candidate seeking the Conservative nomination in Halton has declared his intention to throw his name into the nomination race scheduled for April 6.

Dr. Art Ross announced his intentions to seek the nomination this week. His announcement follows similar indications from sitting member Otto Jelinek and Queen's Park economist Triss Lett.

Dr. Ross practised medicine in Oakville from 1951 to 1968 and went to Mexico and accepted a professorship at medical school there along with work with the Hui-chol Indians.

He moved to Lake Placid, New York in 1971 and later attended the University of Toronto for one year where he received a degree in public health. From 1973 to 1978 he headed the department of clinical medicine in Guadalajara. In 1976 he received a one year contract with the Canadian Department of Health and Welfare to carry out a task related to medical care in West Africa, and worked on that until fall of 1977. With the exception of one year, he arranged and sponsored his own trips independent of government support.

Dr. Ross said he had always been interested in politics but had never been inclined to seek a nomination. His father served in both Queen's Park and Ottawa for a combined total of 27 years. Knowing the demands of the time, Dr. Ross had once declined against a career in politics.

"Now, I feel it is time for people like me with devotion to our country and experience and will, to step in and try to undo some of the havoc

caused by professional politicians and ill-directed bureaucrats," he said.

"Halton is a unique riding with a broad cross section of almost every profession, from agriculture to corporate affairs and scientific research. There are experts here in almost every field and their opinions are valuable. Halton deserves strong representation; someone who is within the party but not a parrot and certainly not someone whose only aim is to say what will be popular."

"I know Halton well from my years as a family doctor. I have been away for some time, but each year I have been back and have kept in contact with my friends here. Looking from a distance often gives a clearer view and better overall picture. My family and I have represented Canada well while we were abroad, and felt more Canadian in the process. I am saddened now to have to accept the sympathy of my friends in developing countries for the state of my country," Dr. Ross said.

Reducing the bureaucracy and seeking a return to responsible government are priorities for Ross.

"I believe that the pensions that serve the poor, and those with marginal incomes, must be protected against the cancerous inflation that is the hallmark of the Liberals, but I see no reason to index pensions for senior civil servants or parliamentarians. If such indexing is desirable, then let it be actuarially sound and let the recipients pay appropriate contributions," he said.

A native of Kingston, Ont., Dr. Ross said he'd grown up with friends whose fathers worked in maximum security prisons.

"I came into contact with families there that let me know how uneasy they felt dealing with people convicted of murder and sentenced to life in prison.

"When capital punishment is withdrawn it does one of two things. It leaves the guards in an endangered position without protection, and it encourages them to shoot at the first threatening gesture."

While he feels there could be nothing worse than having a man killed for a crime he never committed, Dr. Ross says he believes in the retention of the death penalty in rare cases and with stringent conditions applied to its use.

He said that when Trudeau

was elected in 1968 he was a fresh face and appeared to have fresh ideas. "I thought, even though I was a Conservative, that this man might do something for the country. My hopes were ill-founded."

"Canada has never been less united and its prestige around the world is no greater than it was 10 years ago."

Dr. Ross said the public can no longer put any stock in comments made by government officials at the federal level and he used the recent indication about postal service as an example.

"First the Prime Minister says we may no longer be able to afford to have postal delivery. Then the postmaster general says the remark was purely speculative and the government has given no consideration to such a move. And that is followed by the statement of a government official about an in-depth study that had been completed to consider the merits of dropping delivery. You can't trust these statements as being true."

He said the country needs both an energy policy and a population policy. He claimed the Trudeau government has run the country on the basis of crisis management.

On Quebec's bid to separate, Dr. Ross says we have to recognize the culture of Quebec and its right to its own culture and language, but at the same time he wouldn't support any special status or special deal for any one part of the country.

"Logically, separation shouldn't come about, but in the end the decision will be an emotional one."

Ross criticized Trudeau's efforts to unite Canada. He claimed Trudeau has done more to break up the country than he has to unite it.
