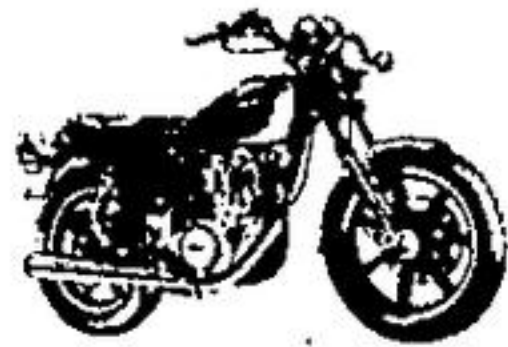

Tragic accident

Tragedy struck a Campbellville family Friday afternoon, when a south bound CN freight train hit and killed Helen Bosada of 7161 Guelph Line, Campbellville at the Derry Rd. railway crossing in Milton.

The 41-year-old mother of four was on her way to the House of Spectacles, Milton, where she worked part-time Tuesdays and Fridays.

An investigation of the wreckage of Mrs. Bosada's 1970 Plymouth Duster has ruled out the possibility of brake failure, stated police. According to two witnesses, she approached the tracks and applied the brakes, but

did not come to a stop. "The lights were flashing and the train whistle sounded, according to both witnesses who were stopped on either side of the tracks," stated Constable Rod Plant, Halton Regional Police, "but apparently for some reason, she just kept going."

Ron Phillips of Oakville, travelling immediately behind the Bosada vehicle, told police he noticed one brake light go on as the vehicle approached the tracks.

Mr. Phillips had travelled behind the Bosada car from the time it left the driveway and recalled only one brake light operated.

"She apparently was doing the legal speed limit," added Constable Plant, "but the roads were greasy from light snow."

An eight-foot snow drift prevented a driver from seeing the train coming from the north direction as well.

"Mr. Phillips was between three and four car lengths behind Mrs. Bosada and was himself unable to see the approaching train. He saw the flashing lights and heard the whistle though."

Constable Plant, who arrived at the scene within minutes of the crash described it as one of the worse vehicle collisions he had seen.

Fringe benefit costs soar

Soaring fringe benefit costs and Halton Board of Education payments into government programs is helping drive school costs up.

Thursday Halton trustees learned a 14 per cent increase in fringe benefit costs were a major factor in the board's \$86.1 million budget. The board has over 3,300 full and part time employees.

Last year figure benefits cost the board \$2,443,507 but this year eight benefit programs will cost \$2,749,345.

The Ontario Municipal Employee's Retirement System will cost Halton ratepayers \$355,850 in 1978 while Canada Pension Plan contributions are expected to total \$587,310.

Unemployment Insurance premiums will cost the board \$760,540 and Ontario Hospitalization Insurance Plan payments will eat up \$559,980.

Extended Health care plan costs will total \$104,756 and the board will have to spend \$162,400 on retirement gratuities.

Workmen's Compensation Board payments are expected to be \$137,620 while the board will spend \$100,880 on Group Life Insurance payments.

It was noted at the budget meeting fringe benefit costs have gone up in each of the last two budgets but actual fringe benefit costs were much lower than expected.
