Will the real landscape please stand up

by Ward Chesworth University of Gueiph The landscape of Southern Ontario is a little like a blackboard that has been written on over and over again, with each successive layer of writing imperfectly erased still partly legible through later layers, Geologists try to read through these layers, right back to the earliest one, in the hope that they can reconstruct a piece of the earth's history.

The latest marks that have been "written" on the landscape are the signs of the white man's settlement of this country. Towns, industries and cultivated fields, roads and railroads all give Ontario the comfortable "lived in" look we take for granted.

But this white man's layer is really quite alien to the land underneath, a land first colonized by the Indian some 12,000 years ago. And even to

these first comers that older landscape must have appeared alien and inhoswith moraines, gravel ridges and sheets of sandy outwash crossed by unpredictable streams. There were no forests then, to soften the harsh features of the land, only a sparse Arctic type of vegetation slowly taking over where glaciers had been a short time before.

Take off this glacial layer

and beneath it you find sedimentary rocks that show that 400 million years ago there was no landscape here, only a seascape. A shallow sea covered all of Southern Ontario and organisms that lived and built reefs in it have left behind fossilized forms as their only memorial. beneath Probe

sedimentary layers and you reach dry land again in the shape of gently rolling hills and valleys that may be as much as 800 million years old. We don't know what it looked like precisely, but to our eyes it would have appeared very bare and uninviting. There would have been no trees, flowers and no grass, all of which were still hundreds of millions of years into the

rocks that form this ancient landscape you find clues to an granite, a rock that originates

in the deep core of mountain chains, and basalt, the commonest of all volcanic rocks. They show that more than a billion years ago Ontario was a mountainous land with active volcanoes throwing out streams of molten lava. And structures in the rocks show that these mountains and volcanoes were preceded by earlier ones going back to two and a half and perhaps even three billion years ago.


At this point the writing becomes unreadable and no record can be found of earlier Ontario landscapes. What did it look like four billion years ago? We have no direct way knowing, but some geologists have suggested that it probably resembled If you look closely at the the surface of the moon pockmarked with craters and covered in loose rubble, a far even earlier one in the form of cry from the countryside we know today.

Train accident prompts inquest Trafalgar Rd. on Britannia

An inquest will be held into the deaths of three construction workers killed in a freak industrial accident at an Ontario Hydro job site east of

A date and location for the inquest is likely to be set within the next two weeks by Dr. Bruce Penton, district supervisor from Catharines, according to Staff Sergeant Eric Bullock of Halton Regional Police.

The three men, employees of Penvidic Contracting, Burlington died when an unmanned idling train engine slipped into gear and plowed into four small trucks parked on the railroad ties.

The accident, which occurred on Ontario Hydroowned land, is being investigated by both Halton Regional Police and Ministry of Labor officials.

According to police, the new track built to transport heavy equipment necessary for Ontario Hydro's new

500kV substation was used by the trucks travelling into the construction site, due to muddy conditions.

There are no crossing guards marking the tracks at Britannia Rd., but according to police a flag man was in use when the company-owned train was operating back and forth on the spur line.

Killed in the accident were train engineer Victor R. Newcombe of Burlington, Jose Carrelas, 52, and Joao Pereira Tavares, 50, both of


