CHICKEN POTATO PIE

1 chicken
1 oz. butter
1 large can condensed vegetable soup
1 large pkg. instant potatoes
2 oz. Gruyere cheese, grated

A. Melt the butter in a large flame-proof dish. Cut the chicken into 8 pieces and fry in butter until golden brown. Add the soup and quarter can of water. Mix well, cover the dish and cook

in centre of the oven for 30 min.

B. Make up the potato as directed on the packet. Put into a piping bag fitted with a star nozzle, pipe the potato over the top of the chicken mixture. Sprinkle with cheese.

C. Grill or bake for a further 10 min. or until the top is golden brown. Serves 4.

Cooking time - 40 min. - oven 375 degrees F. (Gas Mark 5).

The meeting emphasized the Society's aim to double

the number of Rheumatologists in Canada by 1981. Canada is considered to have one of the best arthritis control programs in the world. The Society's goal in the next few years will be to develop enough Rheumatologists to have one in about 29 more communities by 1981. This would make excellent arthritis care available to about 80 per cent of Canada's population.

Dr. Donald McNeely, Rheumatologist, said, "The progress made by The Arthritis Society in the 30 years since it was founded on March 15, 1948 is something which should make all of your volunteers proud."

The meeting was chaired by Dr. Eileen Alexander, Region Chairman, of Welland.
