



June trial for 'Priest'

A man who describes himself as a priest and ran an alleged religious retreat on the Fifth Line north of Limehouse goes on trial for fraud

and rape in June. Denis Edward appeared in Halton County Court Monday before Judge Allan B. Sprague who set his trial to begin June 5. The first week of the two week trial will be on the fraud charge. The second week will be for the rape charge.

Scallen, who calls himself Father Benedict Maria, is a divorcee and former scientist who pioneered research into growing tomatoes at the metal clad buildings on the Fifth Line, The building is marked Benedictines Mary Immaculate."

He was arrested last fall following a six-month police investigation. Scallen remains out on bail.

Fraud charges against the self-styled priest allege he misrepresented himself as a Roman Catholic priest to obtain money.

Neighbors have described goings on at the Fifth Line building over the past few years as "mysterious."

He attracted women from as far away as the United States as "nuns". They thought they were real sisters and he was a real priest.


