Baetz corrects view of ICG

Reuben Baetz painted a battle scene for the Legislature this week with the Interested Citizens' Group fighting Ontario (ICG) Hydro. This version replaces the more peaceful picture Baetz drew earlier.

Baetz told the House Monday he learned the ICG will continue to oppose the Bruce-Milton hydro corridor. "I am, of course, disappointed to hear this", Baetz said. This latest information will not change the ministry's decision to proceed with the present route, Baetz continued.

In a March 16 debate at Queen's Park Baetz told Julian Reed, (L-Halton-Burlington) the ICG would say it has to accept reality and also that the citizens' group agrees "that the line going as it now will be going was in fact the best of all


