

New gun laws mainly aimed at irresponsible

Stricter gun control laws are being enforced across Canada in an effort to reduce criminal and other irresponsible use of guns.

The majority of gun owners and users, says a newly issued national pamphlet, Gun Control in Canada, are responsible hunters and target shooters. "These people will continue to enjoy these legitimate pastimes without significant hindrance. They should, however, be aware of those provisions which involved the safe handling of firearms and effective January 1, 1979, the requirements necessary to obtain a Firearms Acquisition Certificate when purchasing or acquiring firearms," the pamphlet says.

"Most of the other changes to the gun control laws affect only those persons who use guns in an irresponsible manner causing needless death and injury.

In the new gun control laws, effective January 1, 1978, there were three main objectives: to reduce the criminal use of guns; to keep guns out of the hands of dangerous persons; and to encourage and ensure responsible gun ownership and use.

To achieve these objectives, the legislation introduces the following measures: the courts are now provided with the authority to prohibit use or owning of firearms by criminals and dangerous persons. The courts can also impose heavier penalties for gun-related offences, such as mandatory prison sentences. In addition police now have greater powers to search for and seize weapons in threatening situations. However, police must subsequently justify any searches and seizures in a report to a magistrate.

Prohibited and Restricted weapons categories have been extensively revised. Controls have been established which will reduce the availability of particularly dangerous weapons which are frequently used for criminal purposes. The legislation includes regulations for the inspection and licensing of firearms businesses to ensure that dealers' premises meet reasonable standards of security and safety.

Starting January 1, 1979, a Firearms Acquisition Certificate will be required by any person wishing to obtain a firearm. The certificates will be issued by the federal government at the local level. Applications may be issued by the federal government at the local level. Applicants may be required to complete competence training and safety tests in provinces where this provision of the firearms legislation has been implemented.

Under the new laws, new prohibited weapons have been named. These are: sawed off shotguns and other rifles or shotguns which have barrels less than 18 inches in length or an overall length of less than 26 inches; fully automatic weapons (i.e. capable of firing bullets in rapid succession during a single pressure of the trigger) which are not registered to a bona fide collector by January 1, 1978. Bona fide collectors currently possessing fully automatic weapons which are registered with the RCMP will be permitted to retain those weapons. However, they will not be permitted to sell, trade, or donate these except to a bona fide collector or approved museums or for export.

As of January 1, all restricted weapons are in the following categories: rifles or shotguns with a muzzle velocity of more than 500 feet per second having a barrel less than 18 1/2 inches in length, capable of discharging centre-fire ammunition in a semi-automatic manner, or firearms such as pistols which are designed or altered or intended to be aimed and fired by the action of one hand;

Firearms designed or adapted to be fired when folded or telescoped to a length of less than 26 inches; Those fully automatic weapons which were registered as restricted weapons before January 1, and which form part of a bona fide gun collection;

Any weapon, rifle or shotgun not considered as reasonable for use in Canada for hunting or sporting purposes and which is specially designated as such.

Copies of Gun Control in Canada—Working Together to Save Lives, may be obtained in local police precincts.

Restrictions, police powers, rights of appeal, offences, and acquiring permits are detailed in the pamphlet, useful to any present or future firearms owner.

Obituary

W.R. Stewart

William Richmond Stewart, who lived here as a boy, died in the Wellesley hospital, Toronto, on Thursday, April 28.

Oldest son of Mr. and Mrs. W.H. Stewart, he was born in Acton while his father was principal of the continuation school. The family moved to Milton in 1918 when his father became the superintendent of the Gordon Home for children, a forerunner of the Children's Aid Society.

He graduated from Toronto Normal School and the University of Toronto. Most of his teaching career was at the University of Toronto Schools. He became an inspector for schools in Ontario and at the time of his retirement was the deputy minister of education for the province.

While in Milton he played on town baseball and hockey teams. He went on to play on the University of Toronto hockey team coached by the late Prime Minister Lester Pearson. He played for Toronto Marlboroughs on a line with future Maple Leaf stars Syl Apps and Joe Primeau. He coached the U.T.S. hockey teams. In later years he was enthusiastic about bridge and golf.

He and Eleanor Sedgewick won the top athletic awards in their senior year at Victoria College and married soon after graduating. She survives Mr. Stewart with four children, Sarah Thompson and Gillian Parker of Toronto, Frances Pool of Fredericton, New Brunswick, and Robert of London, England.

Also surviving are sister Marguerite (Mrs. Roy Brown), brothers Bob and George Stewart of Toronto. He is predeceased by sisters Mary Louise Stewart Sinclair and Elsie K. Stewart.

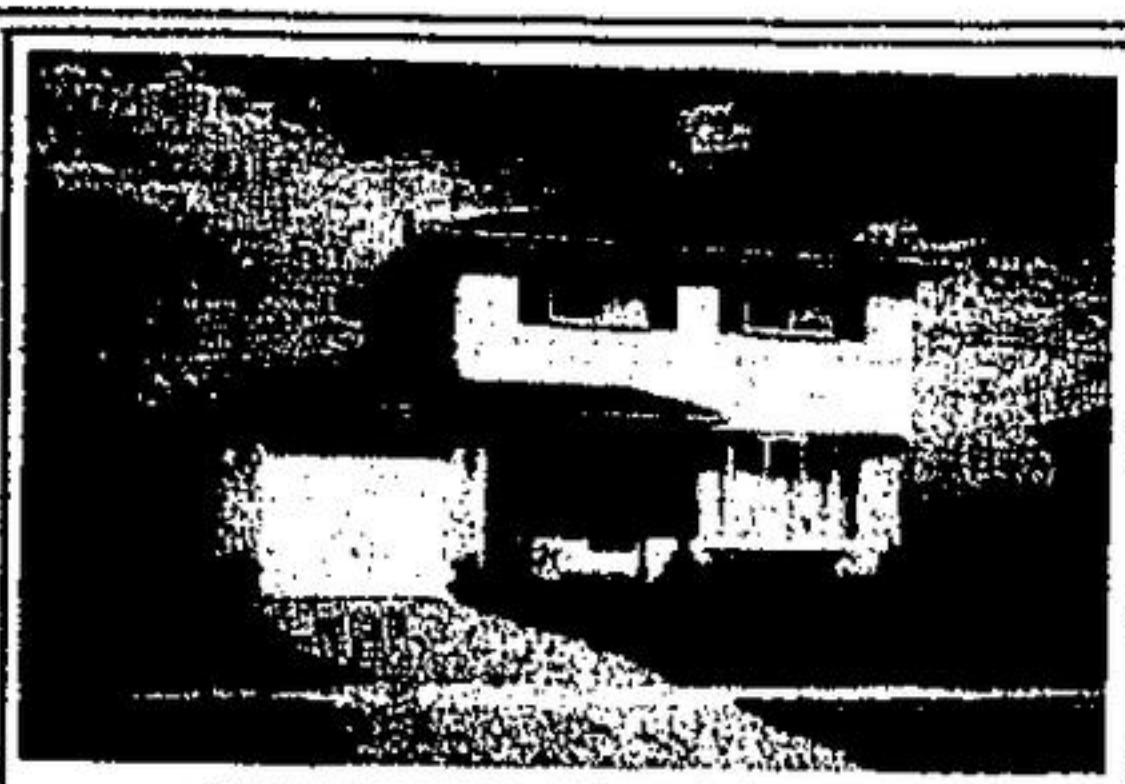
