"The possibilities are mind-boggling," says Frank Winter, Dean of Instructional Development at Sheridan and one of the Micro Age '78

organizers. "We will have some of the biggest names in the world of microcomputers here for two days plus a wide range of hardware and software. The interest in microcomputers is just overwhelming."

Admission to Micro Age '78 is \$3 per person and there will be plenty of free parking. Sheridan College is located on Trafalgar Rd. in Oakville just north of the QEW.
