## Tennis clubs are set for season

In a period of approximately six months during 1975, nine new tennis courts were developed in the Town of Halton Hills to better handle the large numbers who were becoming interested in the sport of tennis. Following this development, the Halton Hills Tennis Association was formed.

The affairs of the association are managed by a group of representatives from each of the presently operating clubs (Gordon Alcott Tennis Club, Acton Tennis Club), and from those using the Emmerson Park and Joseph Gibbons Park locations.

The primary functions of the association are to act as a liaison with the Town of Halton Hills recreation department, co-ordinate tennis activities, sustain a high standard of tennis, organize and regulate town wide tournaments, complement club programs through coaching clinics, and provide recommendations for any development of future tennis facilities in Halton Hills.

With the disbanding of the former clubs at the Emmerson Park and Joseph Gibbons Park locations in 1976, the operation of these courts was directed by the

association. Regulated playing schedules at all courts have been made possible through the efforts of interested tennis enthusiasts. Interested players are always encouraged and welcome to assist the association in the promotion of tennis.

## Dry lime is out on playing fields

Community groups using the soccer and baseball playing fields in Halton Hills this summer needn't worry about their players receiving eye injuries or burns as a result of the use of dry lime.

Adrian Foster, who has been hired to supervise park attendants this summer, told last Wednesday night's Georgetown recreation advisory committee meeting that talcum will be used to mark out playing fields for the first two weeks of May, then the lines will be painted on permanently.

Foster, a University of Western Ontario graduate working for the summer before enrolling in graduate school at York, reported the recreation department should be able to save money over last year since it has been promised free use of a machine to paint the lines on by the Town of Brampton.

Last year the recreation department spent approximately \$400 to mark out playing fields using talcum all summer. Foster said the painting process will have to be carried out only twice, at the beginning of the season and half way through the summer. He said any lime the department has left over will be used in outhouses at Limehouse.

Eight attendants have been hired to work under Foster for varying lengths of time. Four, who began work Monday and are hired for just two weeks, will clean up all the debris and garbage in Halton Hills parks. Four more will begin work in the final week of May and will be on the summer staff for 15 weeks until Labor Day week-end. They'll work regular hours.

This year it will be the responsibility of the groups to turn lights on and off at playing fields. Last summer park attendants worked afternoon (4-12) shifts so that they could do that job, but the recreation advisory committee complained that they could be better used in the daytime to clean up parks and line out playing fields.

Recreation co-ordinator Anne Pickering said all groups are encouraged to contact Adrian at 877-5185, extension 62, if they encounter any problems.

Barry Gambles of the committee reported it's obvious people are using the garbage cans, which have been placed in town parks, since the condition of parks is excellent so far. He said, however, that the light standards on the tennis courts at Emmerson Park are tilting badly and

might fall over completely some day.

Stu Robbins said the situation at the Delrex Parkette, where a drain pipe and pieces of concrete are sticking up out of the ground should be checked.

Robbins also reported that at Joseph Gibbons Park a ladder has been broken off some playground equipment and is being used by children as a teeter totter across concrete drains.

Gambles, Robbins, John Day and Colin Wilde attended the meeting along with Councilor Peter Morris, Miss Pickering and Foster. Committee chairman Clore Rlepma absent.
