tricians while loser Bryan Lawrence sent 14 down swinging.

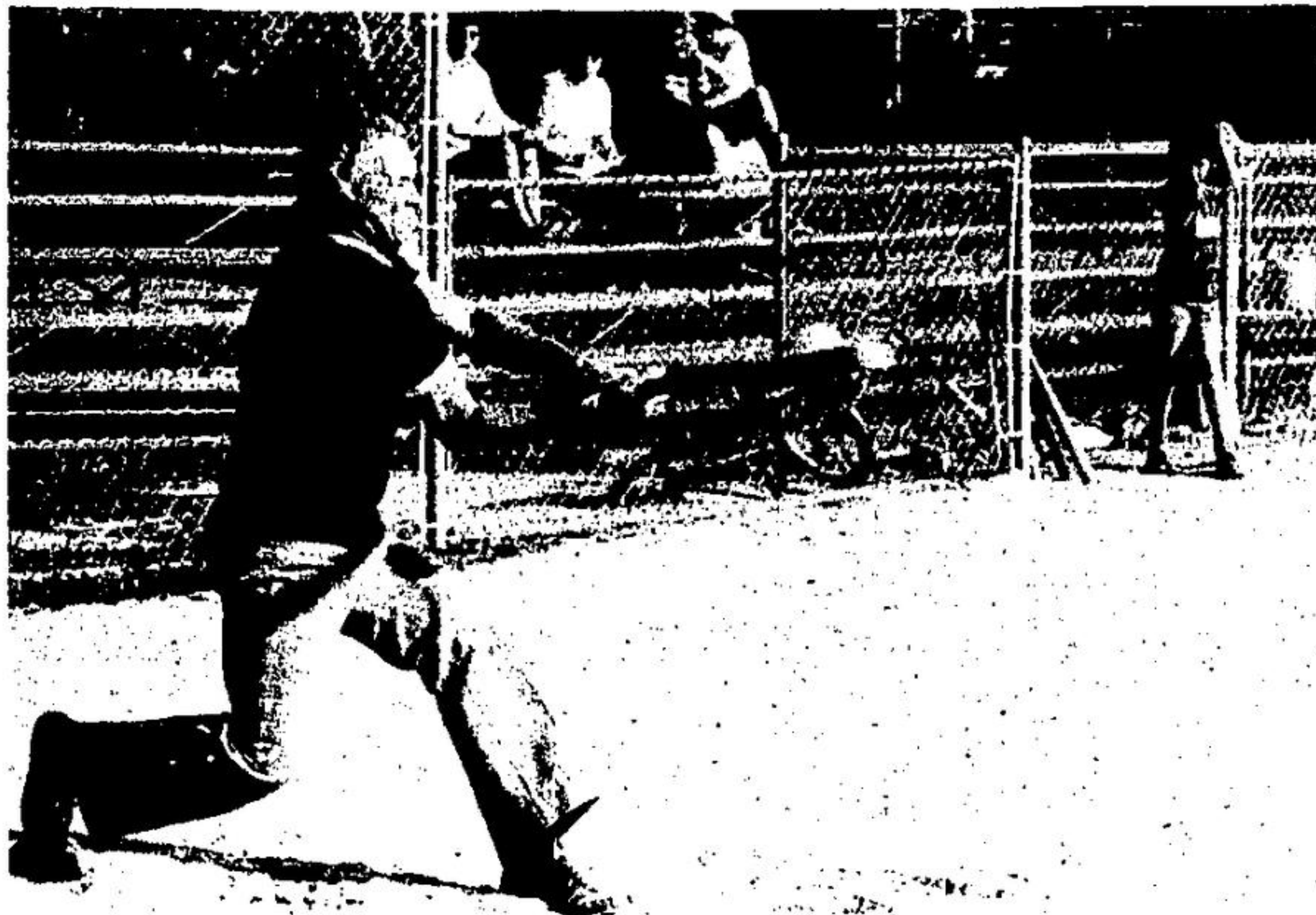
