Local ecologists, amateur and otherwise will agree with this excerpt from the Review editorial, A Moral Obligation: "It is no longer appropriate to fantasize about vast areas of wilderness and teeming herds of wildlife. The threat to wildlife through the world cannot be minimized, but in Ontario alone, few of us realize how many species of plants and animals there are, and the number of practical problems which require solving."

With the exception of the West Virginia white butterfly, none of the endangered species are now native to Halton county. However, perhaps we could begin compiling our own list of disappearing species. How often these days does one see a garden toad or a garter snake? Remember as kids how common these creatures were? Quoting again from Historical Perspective: "Perhaps the most important lesson, to be learned from the past is that no species should be taken for granted. Even 'common' species are part of our heritage, and require our attention and care."

Ontario Fish and Wildlife Review is always worth reading. The current issue should be of great interest to all "critter" lovers. Have you ever heard of a "pregnant father"? This is not just wishful thinking on the part of female chauvinists. Pregnant fathers exist in sea waters off the south coast of Australia. Here Paul A. Zahl photographed for National Geographic, leafy and weedy sea dragons. Mom sea dragon (weedy) has it made, because Daddy's job is to incubate the eggs she lays under her mate's tail.

Dragons of the Deep is a fascinating picture story in the June Geographic. Would you like to double your reading speed in a week? Speed Reading Made Easy offers a complete self-taught course.
