## LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT 1978

Leadership Development is a program for teenagers 13 years and over who are interested in recreation, in fun, and in their community.

The program will offer two (2) weeks of theoretical training to the successful applicants in such areas as the role of a play leader, program planning and development, children, problem solving and evaluation, community relations, discipline, camp and nature lore, games and crafts. Following this, each participant will be required to complete a minimum of 100 hours placement during a six week period in various summer programs.

An advanced program opportunity will be provided to returning participants.

Those who satisfactorily complete the course will receive a certificate of achievement. If they have demonstrated good leadership qualities, they will be invited to attend the pre-selection training offered in February for potential summer staff with the Halton Hills Recreation and Parks Department.

## YOUTH INVOLVEMENT CENTRE

## HALTON REGION CONSERVATION AUTHORITY

### Summer Resource Program 1978

A fun and challenging summer program for girls and boys ages 8 to 14 years, offered by the Halton Region Conservation Authority. The program offers both recreational and educational activities geared toward a better understanding of the environment as well as its conservation and management.

Educational activities: Pond, Stream, Bird and Pioneer Studies; Orienteering;  
Recreational activities: Canoeing, Hiking, Swimming, Arts & Crafts;

Two week programs also include: Survival techniques, sailing, overnight;  
Advanced program (July 24-Aug. 4) also includes: Advanced canoeing, backpacking and overnight camp; Lake Study; Timber cruising; Agricultural Museum

Programs will be held at the Mountsberg Wildlife Centre and the Kelso Conservation Area. Each area has identical programs. Students are bused from one area to the other to make maximum use of all facilities.
